FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

If you were to ask a random person on the street, "What is the purpose of the Christian life?" What kind of answers would we get? Most commonly, we'd probably get some variation that the Christian life is all about being nice and kind. Just do a bunch of nice things for people, being "loving" toward all those you meet. In many ways, it's the reduction of the Christian ideal to simply, "Don't be a big meanie." Since the 1970's, a massive cultural shift has happened in the Church, especially in the West, namely Europe and the United States. It attempted to jettison the dogmatic differences between the religions and instead, replaced it with a vague idea of being nice. Bishop Robert Barron famously coined the phrase describing this type of religiosity as "beige Catholicism." Its hallmark is an intellectual hollow, non-committal, synchronistic (meaning all religions are the same), counterfeit of the faith. Jesus is no different than the other wise, religious leaders of history. He is like Buddha but with a beard and sandals. It insists on no objective truth, just the version of your truth and my truth. Religion becomes a hobby; something nice to do in your spare time, rather than the soul and foundation of your existence.

Take this common viewpoint of religion in our modern culture and compare it to the words of St. Paul in the Second Reading. He reminds the Christians of his day, "You who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be *holy*." There it is! That last word, "to be holy" is the key to unlocking the purpose of the Christian life. The first time we encounter this word holy is in the book of Genesis, as God creates the world. It says in Genesis chapter 2, that the seventh day is meant to be "holy" as a day of rest to be with God. In other words, he creates the whole universe to share in his very life. The human person is the pinnacle of his creation, made in his "image and likeness", given the very "breath" of God in our souls. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in paragraph 2809 put it even more beautifully: "The holiness of God is the center of God's inaccessible center." In other words, to be holy is to be like God.

That my friends is the radical life we are called to live as Christians. We're called to be holy, not just to be "nice". My heart longs for a greater adventure than simply to be polite, as important as that is. St. Paul is trying to remind the Christians in the church of Corinth of their new identity that Jesus Christ won for us through his death. After Original Sin we lost that life and the word "holy" is no longer used in the entire Book of Genesis. It would only reappear in the Book of Exodus as God famously begins his work of saving humanity with Moses on Mount Sinai. "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is *holy* ground." (Cf. Exodus 3:5). It's holy becomes God would begin to restore their true identity, lost by sin, and finally culminating in Jesus Christ.

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María,

Si le preguntaras a una persona desconocida en la calle, “¿Cuál es el propósito de la vida cristiana?” ¿Qué tipo de respuestas obtendríamos? Más comúnmente, probablemente obtendríamos alguna variación de que la vida cristiana se trata de ser bueno y amable. Solo hacer varias cosas buenas para las personas, siendo "cariñoso" con todas las personas que conoce. En muchos sentidos, es la deducción del ideal cristiano a simplemente: "No ser malo". Desde la década de 1970, ha ocurrido un cambio cultural masivo en la Iglesia, especialmente en Occidente, en específico, Europa y los Estados Unidos. Intentó deshacerse de las diferencias dogmáticas entre las religiones y, en cambio, lo reemplazó con una vaga idea de ser amable. El obispo Robert Barron acuñó la famosa frase que describe este tipo de religiosidad como “catolicismo beis”. Su sello distintivo es un vacío intelectual, sin compromiso, sincrónico (lo que significa que todas las religiones son iguales), falsificación de la fe. Jesús no es diferente a los demás sabios líderes religiosos de la historia. Es como Buda, pero con barba y sandalias. No insiste en ninguna verdad objetiva, solo en la versión de tu verdad y mi verdad. La religión se convierte en un pasatiempo; algo agradable que hacer en tu tiempo libre, en lugar del alma y fundamento de tu existencia.

Tome este punto de vista común de la religión en nuestra cultura moderna y compárelo con las palabras de San Pablo en la Segunda Lectura. Les recuerda a los cristianos de su día: “A todos ustedes, a quienes Dios santificó en Cristo Jesús y que son su pueblo santo.” ¡Ahí está! Esa última palabra, “ser santo”, es la clave para desbloquear el propósito de la vida cristiana. La primera vez que encontramos esta palabra, santo, es en el libro de Génesis, cuando Dios creó el mundo. Dice en Génesis capítulo 2, que el séptimo día está destinado a ser "santo" como un día de descanso para estar con Dios. En otras palabras, creó todo el universo para compartir su propia vida. La persona humana es el pináculo de su creación, hecha a su “imagen y semejanza”, dada el mismo “soplo” de Dios en nuestras almas. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en el párrafo 2809, lo expresó aún más bellamente: “La santidad de Dios es el centro del centro inaccesible de Dios”. En otras palabras, ser santo es ser como Dios.

Eso mis amigos, es la vida radical que estamos llamados a vivir como cristianos. Estamos llamados a ser santos, no solo a ser “buenos”. Mi corazón anhela una aventura mayor que simplemente ser cortés, por más importante que eso sea. San Pablo está tratando de recordar a los cristianos de la iglesia de Corinto la nueva identidad

que Jesucristo ganó para nosotros a través de su muerte. Después del Pecado Original perdimos esa vida y la palabra “santo” ya no se usa más en todo el Libro del Génesis. Solo reaparecería en el Libro del Éxodo cuando Dios comienza su famosa obra de salvar a la humanidad, con Moisés en el Monte Sinaí. “quita tus sandalias de tus pies, porque el lugar en que tú estás, tierra santa es.” (Cf. Éxodo 3, 5). Es santo se convierte en Dios comenzaría a restaurar su verdadera identidad, perdido por el pecado, y finalmente culminando en Jesucristo.
