FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

Typically, on December 28th we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Innocents. The feast day commemorates the account in the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 2:13-18), when Herod "ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity two years and under, in accordance with the time he ascertained from the magi". (Mt 2:16b) We know that Herod was certainly capable of such treachery. He had already had three of his sons killed because he felt his authority threatened by them. Even though Herod knew that the Holy Family had escaped from Bethlehem, he still carried out his murderous act. Matthew writes: "When Herod realized that he had been deceived by the magi, he became furious." (Mt 2:16a) The Feast of the Holy Innocents is traditionally a day when we remember to pray more intentionally for all the holy innocents, the little ones in the wombs of their mothers waiting to be born. We pray through the intercession of the Holy Innocents for an end to abortion and for healing for those suffering from the aftermaths of abortion.

The first half of the Gospel on the Feast of the Holy Innocents recounts how the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. This was the second time that Joseph received instructions while dreaming. The first time was when he was told that Mary had conceived Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit and that he should take her into his home as his wife. On this second angelic "dream visit", Joseph is told to "take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you". (Mt 2:13) St. Matthew notes: "Joseph rose and took the child and this mother by night and departed for Egypt." (Mt 2:14)

By Joseph's immediate action to protect Mary and Jesus, he witnesses to us the importance of being ready at all times and the importance of obedience. To be sure, a number of you had the experience last August of having to depart your homes immediately, and in the middle of the night, on account of the approaching LNU Complex fire. No doubt, it was stressful and nerve-wracking. You had a taste of the stress felt by the Holy Family and you experienced first-hand what it feels like to be exiled from the place that you called home. The Holy Family went into exile to Egypt to escape Herod, but also to pre-figure the Son's exile on Holy Saturday when he "descended into hell" as we pray in the Creed. Pope Benedict XVI explains:

"With the flight into Egypt and the return to the promised land, Jesus grants the definitive Exodus. He is truly the Son. He is not going to run away from the Father. He returns home, and he leads others home. He is always on the path toward God and thus he leads the way back from exile to the homeland, back to all that is authentic and true."

Jesus, the true Son, himself went into exile in a very deep sense, in order to lead all of us home from exile." (Jesus of Nazareth, The Infancy Narratives, pp. 111-112)

Through the grace of the sacraments, which are fruit of Our Lord's death on the Cross and His Resurrection, the Son brings us always again and again out of exile and back to God.

As we give thanks to God for the gift of the Incarnation, we remember that the main purpose God came to us in the way He did was to "save his people from their sins". (Mt 1:21) This is truly good news indeed!

Special Blessings

Some special blessings are coming up related to the Epiphany of the Lord (traditionally celebrated January 6)! After the 8:00 Mass **Tuesday, January 5**, Fr. Wood will bless Epiphany water. This ancient rite of the blessing of the waters, with its powerful prayers of exorcism, renders Epiphany Water more spiritually potent than 'ordinary' holy water. Bring along a jar or jug of water to be blessed for your family.

After the 8:00 Mass on Wednesday, January 6, Fr. Wood will bless other items traditionally blessed on the Epiphany: chalk, gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The faithful can have their items of gold blessed (such as wedding rings and rosaries), myrrh for medicinal use, and frankincense to be used for the Epiphany home blessing and other liturgical feasts, along with any other statues, candles, medals, etc

Finally, January 6 and the week following is the traditional time of year to have your home blessed by a priest. Please contact the parish office if you would like Fr. Wood or Fr. Berg to celebrate the annual blessing of your home and family.

SOLEMNIDAD DE LA EPIFANÍA DEL SEÑOR

3 de enero de 2020

Magos del oriente llegaron, diciendo: "¿Dónde está el rey de los judíos que ha nacido?" (Mateo 2:1-12).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

Normalmente, el 28 de diciembre celebramos la festividad de los Santos Inocentes. La festividad conmemora el relato en el Evangelio de Mateo (Mt 2: 13-18), cuando Herodes "mandó matar a todos los niños varones en Belén y en todos sus alrededores, de dos años de edad para abajo, conforme al tiempo que había averiguado de los magos." (Mt 2:16b) Sabemos que Herodes era ciertamente capaz de tal traición. Ya había mandado matar a tres de sus hijos porque sentía su autoridad amenazada por ellos. A pesar de que Herodes sabía que la Sagrada Familia había escapado de Belén, todavía llevó a cabo su acto homicida. Mateo escribe: "Herodes, al verse burlado por los magos, se enojó sobremanera ". (Mt 2:16a) La festividad de los Santos Inocentes es tradicionalmente un día en el que nos acordamos de orar más especialmente por todos los santos inocentes, los pequeños en el vientre de sus madres a la espera de nacer. Oremos por la intercesión de los Santos Inocentes por el fin del aborto y por la sanación de aquellos que sufren de las secuelas del aborto.

La primera parte del Evangelio en la festividad de los Santos Inocentes relata cómo el ángel del Señor se apareció a José en un sueño. Esta fue la segunda vez que José recibió instrucciones a través de sus sueños. La primera vez fue cuando se le dijo que María había concebido a Jesús por el poder del Espíritu Santo y que debía llevarla a su casa como su esposa. En esta segunda "visita en sueño" angelical, se le dice a José "toma al niño y a su madre, y huye a Egipto. Quédate allá hasta que yo te diga". (Mt 2:13) San Mateo señala: "Entonces José se levantó, tomó de noche al niño y a su madre, y se fue a Egipto. (Mt 2:14)

Por la acción inmediata de José para proteger a María y Jesús, nos hace testigos de la importancia de estar preparados en todo momento y de la importancia de la obediencia. Sin duda, varios de ustedes tuvieron la experiencia en agosto pasado de tener que salir de sus casas inmediatamente, y en medio de la noche, debido al incendio del Complejo LNU que se acercaba. Sin duda, fue estresante. Tuvieron una muestra del estrés que sintió la Sagrada Familia y vivieron de primera mano lo que se siente el ser exiliado del lugar que llaman hogar. La Sagrada Familia se exilió a Egipto para escapar de Herodes, pero también para pre-figurar el exilio del Hijo el Sábado Santo cuando "descendió al infierno" tal como lo rezamos en el Credo. El Papa Benedicto XVI explíca:

"Con la huida a Egipto y el regreso a la tierra prometida, Jesús concede el éxodo definitivo. Él es verdaderamente el Hijo. No va a huir del Padre. Regresa a

casa, y conduce a otros a casa. Siempre está en el camino hacia Dios y así conduce el camino de regreso del exilio a la patria, de regreso a todo lo que es auténtico y verdadero. Jesús, el verdadero Hijo, se exilió en un sentido muy profundo, para llevarnos a todos a casa desde el exilio." (Jesús de Nazaret, Las Narrativas de la Infancia, pgs. 111-112)

Por medio de la gracia de los sacramentos, los cuales son fruto de la muerte de Nuestro Señor en la Cruz y de Su resurrección, el Hijo nos trae siempre una y otra vez del exilio y de regreso a Dios.

Al dar gracias a Dios por el don de la Encarnación, recordamos que el propósito principal por el cual Dios vino a nosotros de la manera en que lo hizo "salvará a su pueblo de sus pecados". (Mt 1:21) ¡Esto es realmente una buena noticia!

¡Se avecinan algunas bendiciones especiales relacionadas con la Epifanía del Señor (tradicionalmente celebrada el 6 de enero)!

Después de la Misa de las 8am el martes 5 de enero, el Padre Wood bendecirá el agua de Epifanía. Este antiguo rito de la bendición de las aguas, con sus poderosas oraciones de exorcismo, hace que el agua de la Epifanía sea más potente espiritualmente que el agua bendita "ordinaria". Traiga consigo un frasco o una jarra de agua para ser bendecido para su familia.

Después de la misa de las 8am el miércoles 6 de enero, el Padre Wood bendecirá otros objetos tradicionalmente bendecidos en la Epifanía: tiza, oro, incienso y mirra. Los fieles pueden tener sus objetos de oro bendecidos (como anillos de boda y rosarios), mirra para uso medicinal, e incienso para ser utilizados para la bendición del hogar de la Epifanía y otras fiestas litúrgicas, junto con cualquier otra estatua, velas, medallas, etc.

Por último, el 6 de enero y la siguiente semana es la época tradicional del año para que su hogar sea bendecido por un sacerdote. Comuníquese con la oficina parroquial al 707-448-2390, si desea que el Padre Wood o el Padre Berg celebren la bendición anual para su hogar y familia.

Por esa misma razón, las acciones y gestos de la liturgia, pertenecen a la comunidad porque son la obra de la comunidad misma, animada y convocada por el Espíritu Santo; aun así, el Espíritu Santo no anula la individualidad de cada miembro de la asamblea, que participa no a título propio sino como parte activa de una comunidad de bautizados que se llama Iglesia y que, domingo a domingo se reúne para celebrar el Reino de Dios por adelantado, para alabar y dar gracias a Dios por habernos dado a Jesucristo; para celebrar la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Cristo en comunión con toda la Iglesia y con el ropaje de la cultura a la que se pertenece y en la cual se ha asumido el Evangelio.


