FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

No doubt, anyone who has made the trek east on I-80 towards Sacramento from Vacaville has seen the huge billboard advertising "In Vitro Fertilization" (IVF). IVF involves treatments whereby a woman's egg is removed from her body and mixed with the man's sperm in order to make an embryo, a tiny baby. The baby is then placed back into the woman's body in order to develop into a fully mature infant. IVF is the most common form of Artificial Reproductive Technologies (ART).

During this *Respect Life Month*, I thought it would be fruitful to review Church teaching on married love, in general, and IVF and ART, in particular. When we consider the gift of human life and the awesome privilege that married couples have of bringing new life into the world, maybe one might ask: "What's the big deal? If human life is so good, why can't we use our knowledge and technology to help couples who are struggling with infertility to have a baby?" As you can imagine, the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) covers this topic. The Catechism notes that: "Research aimed at reducing human sterility is to be encouraged, on condition that it is placed 'at the service of the human person, of his inalienable rights, and his true and integral good according to the design and will of God.'" (CCC, 2375)

In other words, when it comes to the gift of children we want to keep in mind what it means to be a child, what it means to be a gift and what it means to be a parent. For one thing, it is important for the child to know from whom he or she originated. That is not possible if the child originated from an anonymous donor. The Catechism explains further: "Techniques that entail the disassociation of husband and wife, by the intrusion of a person other than the couple (donation of sperm or ovum, surrogate uterus), are gravely immoral. These techniques (heterologous artificial insemination and fertilization) infringe on the child's right to be born of a father and mother known to him and bound to each other by marriage. They betray the spouses' 'right to become a father and mother only through each other.'" (CCC, 2376, cf. *Donum Vitae*, II, 1)

Okay, someone might say, but what if the couple uses available technology combined with their own fertility, isn't that okay? Again the Catechism clarifies: "Techniques involving only the married couple....remain morally unacceptable. They disassociate the sexual act from the procreative act. The act which brings the child into existence is no longer an act by which two persons give themselves to one another, but one that 'entrusts the life and identity of the embryo into the power of doctors and biologists and establishes the domination of technology over the origin and destiny of the human person. Such a

relationship of domination is in itself contrary to the dignity and equality that must be common to parents and children.'" (CCC, 2377, cf. *Donum Vitae*, II, 5.) Above all, we are reminded that "a child is not something owed to one, but it is a gift." (CCC, 2378)

In other words, spouses do not have a right to have biological children. Indeed, children are a gift to spouses. While it is true that many faithful couples struggle to have biological children, others resort to ART's out of ignorance or for some other reason. However, God-given children are always a gift and never a right. Church teaching rejects the use of ART's because, for one, they do not respect the fertility of the man and the woman. Moreover, as noted above, resorting to ART's can create a situation where the child may not know its biological father or mother. Another major problem, indeed, the biggest problem, is that in the IVF process, often multiple eggs are fertilized and then later destroyed, because a couple does not want to have triplets, quadruplets or quintuplets. The destruction of the fertilized egg amounts to abortion, which is the killing of an innocent life and always wrong.

The good news is that there is a better way for couples struggling to conceive. This better way is morally sound, approved by the Church, scientific and much more "friendly" to the spiritual and bodily welfare of the spouses than ART's, and, therefore, much better for their children, the family and the world that we live in. Next week, I will discuss this better way. May you have a blessed week!



Devuelve al César lo que es del César y a Dios lo que es de Dios (Mateo 22:15-21).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

Sin duda, cualquiera que haya hecho el recorrido hacia el este por la Interestatal-80 en dirección a Sacramento de Vacaville, ha visto la enorme cartelera que anuncia "Fertilización In Vitro" (FIV). La FIV implica tratamientos mediante los cuales el óvulo de una mujer es removido de su cuerpo y mezclado con el esperma del hombre con el fin de crear un embrión, un pequeño bebé. El bebé se coloca de nuevo en el cuerpo de la mujer con el fin de convertirse en un bebé completamente maduro. La FIV es la forma más común de Tecnologías Artificiales Reproductivas (TAR).

Durante este Mes de Respeto por la Vida, pensé que sería fructífero repasar la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre el amor matrimonial, en general, y la FIV y TAR, en particular. Cuando consideramos el don de la vida humana y el increíble privilegio que tienen las parejas casadas de traer una nueva vida al mundo, quizás uno se pregunte: "¿Cuál es el gran problema? Si la vida humana es tan buena, ¿por qué no podemos usar nuestro conocimiento y tecnología para ayudar a las parejas que están batallando con la infertilidad para tener un bebé?" Como se puede imaginar, el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica (CDF) cubre este tema. El Catecismo señala que: "Las investigaciones que intentan reducir la esterilidad humana deben alentarse, a condición de que se pongan "al servicio de la persona humana, de sus derechos inalienables, de su bien verdadero e integral, según el plan y la voluntad de Dios" (CDF, instr. "Donum vitae" 2375).

En otras palabras, cuando se trata del don de los hijos debemos tener en cuenta lo que significa ser un hijo, lo que significa ser un don y lo que significa ser padre. Por un lado, es importante que el hijo sepa de quién se originó. Esto no es posible si el hijo se originó de un donante anónimo. El Catecismo explica, además: "Las técnicas que provocan una disociación de la paternidad por intervención de una persona extraña a los cónyuges (donación del esperma o del óvulo, préstamo de útero) son gravemente deshonestas. Estas técnicas (inseminación y fecundación artificiales heterólogas) lesionan el derecho del niño a nacer de un padre y una madre conocidos de él y ligados entre sí por el matrimonio. Quebrantan "su derecho a llegar a ser padre y madre exclusivamente el uno a través del otro" (CDF, 2376 "Donum vitae" 2, 4).

Bien, alguien podría decir, pero ¿y si la pareja usa la tecnología disponible combinada con su propia fertilidad, no está bien? Una vez más el Catecismo aclara: "Practicadas dentro de la pareja, estas técnicas [inseminación y fecundación artificiales homólogas] son quizá menos perjudiciales, pero no dejan de ser moralmente reprobables. Disocian el

acto sexual del acto procreador. El acto fundador de la existencia del hijo ya no es un acto por el que dos personas se dan una a otra, sino que "confía la vida y la identidad del embrión al poder de los médicos y de los biólogos, e instaura un dominio de la técnica sobre el origen y sobre el destino de la persona humana. Una tal relación de dominio es en sí contraria a la dignidad e igualdad que debe ser común a padres e hijos" (Cf. CDF, 2377 "Donum vitae" 82). Sobre todo, se nos recuerda que "El hijo no es un *derecho* sino un *don*". (CDF, 2378)

En otras palabras, los cónyuges no tienen derecho a tener hijos biológicos. De hecho, los hijos son un don para los cónyuges. Si bien es cierto que muchas parejas fieles luchan por tener hijos biológicos, otras recurren a TAR por ignorancia o por alguna otra razón. Sin embargo, los hijos dados por Dios son siempre un don y nunca un derecho. La enseñanza de la Iglesia rechaza el uso de TAR porque, por ejemplo, no respetan la fertilidad del hombre y de la mujer. Además, como se ha señalado anteriormente, recurrir a TAR pueden crear una situación en la que el niño puede no conocer a su padre biológico o a su madre. Otro problema importante, de hecho, el mayor problema, es que, en el proceso de FIV, a menudo se fertilizan múltiples óvulos y luego se destruyen, porque una pareja no quiere tener trillizos, cuatrillizos o quintillizos. La destrucción del óvulo fertilizado equivale al aborto, que es el asesinato de una vida inocente y siempre equivocada.

La buena noticia es que hay una mejor manera para las parejas que luchan por concebir. Este mejor camino es moralmente sano, aprobado por la Iglesia, científico y mucho más "amigable" para el bienestar espiritual y corporal de los cónyuges que TAR, y, por lo tanto, mucho mejor para sus hijos, la familia y el mundo en el que vivimos. La próxima semana, discutiré esto de mejor manera. ¡Que tengas una semana bendita!


