FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

The month of October is the month of the Rosary. On this last weekend of October, I share with you an excerpt from St. Pope John Paul II's beautiful Apostolic Letter "[The Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary](#)". May you have a blessed week.

In Paragraph 10, Pope John Paul II writes:

The contemplation of Christ has an *incomparable model* in Mary. In a unique way the face of the Son belongs to Mary. It was in her womb that Christ was formed, receiving from her a human resemblance which points to an even greater spiritual closeness. No one has ever devoted himself to the contemplation of the face of Christ as faithfully as Mary. The eyes of her heart already turned to him at the Annunciation, when she conceived him by the power of the Holy Spirit. In the months that followed she began to sense his presence and to picture his features. When at last she gave birth to him in Bethlehem, her eyes were able to gaze tenderly on the face of her Son, as she "wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger" (Lk2:7).

Thereafter Mary's gaze, ever filled with adoration and wonder, would never leave him. At times it would be a *questioning look*, as in the episode of the finding in the Temple: "Son, why have you treated us so?" (Lk 2:48); it would always be a *penetrating gaze*, one capable of deeply understanding Jesus, even to the point of perceiving his hidden feelings and anticipating his decisions, as at Cana (cf. Jn 2:5). At other times it would be a *look of sorrow*, especially beneath the Cross, where her vision would still be that of a mother giving birth, for Mary not only shared the passion and death of her Son, she also received the new son given to her in the beloved disciple (cf. Jn 19:26-27). On the morning of Easter hers would be a *gaze radiant with the joy of the Resurrection*, and finally, on the day of Pentecost, a *gaze afire* with the outpouring of the Spirit (cf. Acts 1:14).

In Paragraph 11, the Holy Father continues:

Mary lived with her eyes fixed on Christ, treasuring his every word: "She kept all these things, pondering them in her heart" (Lk 2:19; cf. 2:51). The memories of Jesus, impressed upon her heart, were always with her, leading her to reflect on the various moments of her life at her Son's side. In a way those memories

were to be the "rosary" which she recited uninterruptedly throughout her earthly life. Even now, amid the joyful songs of the heavenly Jerusalem, the reasons for her thanksgiving and praise remain unchanged. They inspire her maternal concern for the pilgrim Church, in which she continues to relate her personal account of the Gospel. *Mary constantly sets before the faithful the "mysteries" of her Son*, with the desire that the contemplation of those mysteries will release all their saving power. In the recitation of the Rosary, the Christian community enters into contact with the memories and the contemplative gaze of Mary.

In Paragraph 12, John Paul II summarizes using the words of Saint Pope Paul VI:

The Rosary, precisely because it starts with Mary's own experience, is an *exquisitely contemplative prayer*. Without this contemplative dimension, it would lose its meaning, as Pope Paul VI clearly pointed out: "Without contemplation, the Rosary is a body without a soul, and its recitation runs the risk of becoming a mechanical repetition of formulas, in violation of the admonition of Christ: 'In praying do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think they will be heard for their many words' (Mt 6:7). By its nature the recitation of the Rosary calls for a quiet rhythm and a lingering pace, helping the individual to meditate on the mysteries of the Lord's life as seen through the eyes of her who was closest to the Lord. In this way the unfathomable riches of these mysteries are disclosed". (Apostolic Exhortation *Marialis Cultus* [2 February 1974], 47: AAS (1974), 156)

ALL SOULS DAY ENVELOPES

If you wish to offer Holy Masses for your departed dear ones, please write the name of the person for whom you want the Holy Mass to be offered/celebrated in the ALL SOULS DAY envelope provided in your envelope packet or you can pick one up at all of the entrances of the church or at the parish office. You are most welcome to drop off the All Soul's Day envelope with your donations in the offertory collection baskets on Saturday's or Sunday's through the month of November or you may also drop them off in the mailbox of the parish office. The office will collect those envelopes and will be kept at the altar as we offer Holy Mass all through the month of November and pray for them.

All Saints Day, Holy Day of Obligation?

All Saints Day is classified as a Holy Day of Obligation. However, when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated. For instance, All Saints Day fell on Saturday in 2014 and Monday in 2010. In these years, Catholics in the United States and in some other countries were not required to attend Mass. All Saints Day will again be on a Monday in 2022 and on a Saturday in 2025; and once again, Catholics will be excused from Mass on those days, if they wish. (Catholics in other countries may still be required to attend mass on All Saints Day — check with your priest or your diocese to determine whether the obligation remains in effect in your country.)

Of course, even in those years when we aren't required to attend, celebrating All Saints Day by attending Mass is a wonderful way for Catholics to honor the saints, who constantly intercede with God on our behalf.

All Souls Day

During All Souls Day, Catholics are encouraged to visit cemeteries to gain plenary indulgences for our loved ones who are no longer with us.

Plenary Indulgence:

**Visit a cemetery and pray for the dead
November 1st to November 8th**

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed.

How to Obtain the Indulgence?

1. Be in the State of Grace
2. Receive Communion Daily
3. Go to Confession
4. Offer Prayers for the deceased in Purgatory
5. Offer Prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father
6. Visit a Cemetery

TRIGÉSIMO PRIMER DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Ama al Señor y a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. No hay ningún mandamiento más importante que estos (Marcos 12:28b-34).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María,

El mes de octubre es el mes del Rosario. En este último fin de semana de octubre, comparto con ustedes un extracto de la hermosa Carta Apostólica de San Juan Pablo II "[El Rosario de la Santísima Virgen María](#)". Que tengan una bendecida semana.

En el Párrafo 10, el Papa Juan Pablo II escribió:

La contemplación de Cristo tiene en María su modelo insuperable. El rostro del Hijo le pertenece de un modo especial. Ha sido en su vientre donde se ha formado, tomando también de Ella una semejanza humana que evoca una intimidad espiritual ciertamente más grande aún. Nadie se ha dedicado con la asiduidad de María a la contemplación del rostro de Cristo. Los ojos de su corazón se concentran de algún modo en Él ya en la Anunciación, cuando lo concibe por obra del Espíritu Santo; en los meses sucesivos empieza a sentir su presencia y a imaginar sus rasgos. Cuando por fin lo da a luz en Belén, sus ojos se vuelven también tiernamente sobre el rostro del Hijo, cuando lo «envolvió en pañales y le acostó en un pesebre» (Lc 2, 7).

Desde entonces su mirada, siempre llena de adoración y asombro, no se apartará jamás de Él. Será a veces una mirada interrogadora, como en el episodio de su extravío en el templo: «Hijo, ¿por qué nos has hecho esto?» (Lc 2, 48); será en todo caso una mirada penetrante, capaz de leer en lo íntimo de Jesús, hasta percibir sus sentimientos escondidos y presentir sus decisiones, como en Caná (cf. Jn 2, 5); otras veces será una mirada dolorida, sobre todo bajo la cruz, donde todavía será, en cierto sentido, la mirada de la 'parturienta', ya que María no se limitará a compartir la pasión y la muerte del Unigénito, sino que acogerá al nuevo hijo en el discípulo predilecto confiado a Ella (cf. Jn 19, 26-27); en la mañana de Pascua será una mirada radiante por la alegría de la resurrección y, por fin, una mirada ardorosa por la efusión del Espíritu en el día de Pentecostés (cf. Hch 1, 14).

En el Párrafo 11, el Santo Padre continuo:

María vive mirando a Cristo y tiene en cuenta cada una de sus palabras: «Guardaba todas estas cosas, y

las meditaba en su corazón» (Lc 2, 19; cf. 2, 51). Los recuerdos de Jesús, impresos en su alma, la han acompañado en todo momento, llevándola a recorrer con el pensamiento los distintos episodios de su vida junto al Hijo. Han sido aquellos recuerdos los que han constituido, en cierto sentido, el 'rosario' que Ella ha recitado constantemente en los días de su vida terrenal.

Y también ahora, entre los cantos de alegría de la Jerusalén celestial, permanecen intactos los motivos de su acción de gracias y su alabanza. Ellos inspiran su materna solicitud hacia la Iglesia peregrina, en la que sigue desarrollando la trama de su 'papel' de evangelizadora. María propone continuamente a los creyentes los 'misterios' de su Hijo, con el deseo de que sean contemplados, para que puedan derramar toda su fuerza salvadora. Cuando recita el Rosario, la comunidad cristiana está en sintonía con el recuerdo y con la mirada de María.

En el Párrafo 12, Juan Pablo II resume usando las palabras de Santo Papa Pablo VI:

El Rosario, precisamente a partir de la experiencia de María, es una oración marcadamente contemplativa. Sin esta dimensión, se desnaturalizaría, como subrayó Pablo VI: «Sin contemplación, el Rosario es un cuerpo sin alma y su rezo corre el peligro de convertirse en mecánica repetición de fórmulas y de contradecir la advertencia de Jesús: "Cuando oréis, no seáis charlatanes como los paganos, que creen ser escuchados en virtud de su locuacidad" (Mt 6, 7). Por su naturaleza el rezo del Rosario exige un ritmo tranquilo y un reflexivo remanso, que favorezca en quien ora la meditación de los misterios de la vida del Señor, vistos a través del corazón de Aquella que estuvo más cerca del Señor, y que desvelen su insondable riqueza».[14]

Es necesario detenernos en este profundo pensamiento de Pablo VI para poner de relieve algunas dimensiones del Rosario que definen mejor su carácter de contemplación cristológica.

El Día de Todos los Santos se clasifica como un Día Santo de Obligación. Sin embargo, cuando cae en sábado o lunes, se deroga la obligación de asistir a Misa. Como ya saben el Día de Todos los Santos este año es un lunes y volverá a caer en un lunes el próximo año, en 2022 y en un sábado en 2025; por lo tanto, los católicos no están obligados a asistir a Misa esos días. (Es posible que aún se requiera que los católicos en otros países asistan a misa el Día de Todos los Santos; consulte con su sacerdote o su diócesis para determinar si la obligación sigue vigente en su país).

Por supuesto, incluso en esos años en que no estamos obligados a asistir, celebrar el Día de Todos los Santos asistiendo a Misa es una manera maravillosa para que los católicos honren a los santos, que constantemente interceden ante Dios en nuestro nombre.

Tenga en cuenta que en Santa Maria hay Misa en ingles de lunes a sábado a las 8am y los martes en español a las 6:30pm. Se les invita este martes, 2 de noviembre a asistir a la Santa Misa y traer sus artículos religiosos que quiera que se bendigan. Habrá una mesa donde podrá colocar sus artículos por bendecir.
