FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, the readings of the Mass move us to consider our own natural end in this world, our passing to eternal life and the second coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ. To assist us in our reflection on these important themes and to move us to action, for this week's column, I would like to share a reflection from Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis on last Sunday's Gospel (The Parable of the Ten Virgins):

As long as we are...pilgrimage together toward the Kingdom along all the highways and byways of life, a continual exchange of goods and mutual support were not only legitimate but absolutely essential. However, when we have reached the goal and suddenly find ourselves at the culminating instant of our lives...at the very moment of encountering the Bridegroom face to face—each of us has to show himself to him for what we have become.... Initiation into the final stages of divine intimacy cannot be conceived in any but these most personal terms, which require the stripping down of my whole self to the essential core. All this for the simple reason that the Bridegroom yearns to behold the shape and gaze of my unique face.

Because God does not love us generically, he does not look for the same quality of love in each one. At that final moment, Christ will be looking for only one thing in me: the inimitable light that he has always wanted to kindle in me and bring forth from me, the unique flame that can flare up only if I have allowed my very heart and soul to catch the fire of his love. This is the light that only I can give, the light that will result from the combustion of my whole being and all its long and intricate becoming, as it offers itself up to the invasion of God's all-consuming Fire of Mercy.

Sobering as the conclusion of the parable may be, we should find much comfort in the very final verse: *Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.* With this admonition, Jesus turns his focus away from the drama of the parable and toward his listeners in the immediate present. His concluding *therefore* encourages them to... begin right now to accumulate oil for the day of their own encounter with the divine Bridegroom. By penetrating words and keen, persuasive images, the patient Teacher is presently hard at work, forming virginal hearts in his hearers, showing them how to distill drop by drop the oil of fidelity and devotion into the lamps of their

hearts, against the day when he, and no other, will come as ardent Lover, demanding a pure, flammable offering where his passion may eternally burn. (Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis, *Fire of Mercy, Heart of the Word: Meditations on the Gospel According to Saint Matthew, Vol III*)

Bible Study

“Oremus - A Guide to Catholic Prayer”

Hello, St. Mary’s parishioners, Exciting news! If you want this Advent to have a greater meaning... if you want develop a closer relationship with God...if you want to improve your prayer life... if you would like to hear God speak to you, then... here is an opportunity! St. Mary’s is beginning a new eight week on-line Bible Study from Ascension Press entitled, “Oremus– A Guide to Catholic Prayer!”

What is the format? – We will play a weekly 30-minute video presented by Father Mark Toups, followed by our own discussion. Afterward in the privacy of your home, there are seven daily readings discussing that aspect of prayer which you privately journal your thoughts to help you grow in prayer.

When does it start? – November 30th, the first Monday of Advent.

Do I need to enroll early? – Yes, for two reasons. One reason there is a participant guide which is available from Ascension Press in a high-quality book form which takes about a week to receive, but there is also an on-line participant guide. The second reason to enroll early is to determine the size the group, in case we need to have two separate groups.

Is a participant guide required? – Although, that would probably the best format to journalize your thoughts, I will email the daily readings to everyone once a week, if desired and you can create your own journal.

How much does it cost? – The web conferencing meeting is a free app, and the only cost would be the participant guide if you like. (\$15 for on-line or \$20 hardcopy)

How do I get a participant guide? – Here is the link to Ascension Press...

Where do we meet? – It will be in a Zoom meeting.

Is “Zoom” allowed for Catholic web conferencing? - The US Catholic Bishops use Zoom. Here is a Catholic News Agency quote...”Denver Newsroom, Nov 6, 2020 / 05:22 pm MT (CNA).- Like a lot of people, U.S. Catholic bishops are spending a great deal of time in Zoom meetings these days. In fact in less than two weeks, their annual fall meeting will be a virtual one.”

When do we meet on Zoom? – We will meet on Monday evenings beginning Nov. 30th at 7pm for eight weeks, but if there is a great deal of response, we can also set up an additional day and time of the week for a second group.

Can I participate without being seen on screen? – Yes, you may watch everyone and talk and still have your “camera” off.

How do I enroll? – Send me an email, wymanadcock@att.net. I will send you a link to the Zoom Meeting.

What are the weekly subjects of the Bible Study?- 1. What is prayer? 2. Before you pray. 3. Lectio Divina. 4. Relational prayer. 5. Spiritual senses. 6. Discernment in prayer. 7. Dealing with distractions. 8. Desolation and consolation.

Let us make this Advent better for our souls and learn how to grow in prayer in a Catholic way!!!

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

Al acercarnos al final del año litúrgico, las lecturas de la Misa nos conmueven a considerar nuestro propio fin natural en este mundo, nuestro paso a la vida eterna y la segunda venida de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Para ayudarnos en nuestra reflexión sobre estos importantes temas y para que nos conmueva a la acción, para la columna de esta semana, quiero compartir una reflexión de Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis sobre el Evangelio del domingo pasado (La Parábola de las Diez Vírgenes):

Mientras estemos... peregrinando juntos hacia el Reino a lo largo de todas las autopistas y caminos de la vida, un continuo intercambio de mercancías y apoyo mutuo eran sólo legítimos, sino absolutamente esenciales. Sin embargo, cuando hemos alcanzado la meta y de repente nos encontramos en el instante culminante de nuestras vidas... en el mismo momento de encontrarnos con el Novio cara a cara, cada uno de nosotros tenemos que mostrarnos a él por lo que nos hemos convertido... La iniciación en las etapas finales de la intimidad divina no puede ser concebida en cualquiera de estos términos más personales, que requieren el despojo de todo mi ser al núcleo esencial. Todo esto por la sencilla razón que el Novio anhela contemplar la forma y la mirada de mi rostro único.

Debido a que Dios no nos ama genéricamente, no busca la misma cualidad de amor en cada uno. En ese momento final, Cristo sólo buscará una cosa en mí: la luz inimitable que siempre ha querido encender en mí y sacar de mí, la llama única que sólo puede estallar si he permitido que mi corazón y mi alma capten el fuego de su amor. Esta es la luz que sólo yo puedo dar, la luz que resultará de la combustión de todo mi ser y de toda su extensa e intrincada conversión, ya que se ofrece a la invasión del fuego consumidor Misericordia de Dios.

Solemnizadora como puede ser la conclusión de la parábola, debemos encontrar mucho consuelo en el verso final: Manténganse alertas, por lo tanto, porque no saben ni el día ni la hora. Con esta amonestación, Jesús desvía su atención del drama de la parábola hacia los presentes en ese momento. Por lo tanto, su conclusión los anima a... comenzar ahora mismo a acumular aceite para el día de su propio encuentro con el Novio divino. Al penetrar palabras e imágenes aplicadas y persuasivas,

el paciente Maestro está trabajando con empeño, formando corazones virginales en sus oyentes, mostrándoles cómo destilar gota a gota el aceite de fidelidad y devoción en las lámparas de sus corazones, para el día en que él, y nadie más, vendrá como ardiente Amante, exigiendo una ofrenda pura e inflamable donde su pasión pueda arder eternamente. SAN ALBERTO MAGNO (1206-1280)

15 de noviembre

El primer amor de Alberto fueron las ciencias, pues mediante ellas descubrió y defendió la grandeza de Dios. Aunque amó las ciencias, más amó la teología. A los 16 años se trasladó a la Universidad de Padua, donde conoció a los dominicos, congregación a la cual se uniría para servir como maestro en Alemania a los 22 años y a los 23 vestir el hábito dominico, pese a la negativa de su padre. Su influencia en el pensamiento cristiano se dio gracias a que inició el diálogo de la fe con las ciencias. Entre sus discípulos tuvo al teólogo de todos los tiempos, Tomás de Aquino, quien sentaría las bases para la teología perenne. A los 48 años fue nombrado Provincial de Alemania, pero renunció para seguir enseñando y estudiando. Después, fue consagrado obispo de Ratisbona, cargo que ejerció durante dos años como un pastor caminante, sencillo y pobre. Fue un gran maestro al que se le dio el título de Magno debido a la amplitud, calidad y profundidad de sus escritos y pensamiento teológico.

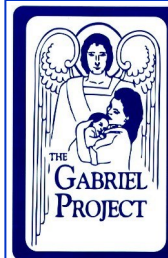
