## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

We have arrived at the last Sunday of the liturgical year! On this Sunday, the Church always honors Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. This year, the Gospel is taken from the Twenty-fifth Chapter of St. Matthew's Gospel where our Lord tells of His coming in glory and of the Last Judgment. It is a sobering reading for sure. In the reading, the righteous ask the King, who represents Our Lord and God: "When did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?" Hopefully, we can provide a positive response to each of these.

The image on the front of this weekend's bulletin is a small detailed section of Michelangelo's "Last Judgment" in the Vatican's Sistine Chapel. The image portrays St. Blaise, St. Catherine of Alexandria and St. Sebastian. Each saint is depicted with the instrument with which the saint was martyred. Thus, St. Blaise is shown with the combs with which his flesh was raked before he was beheaded. St. Catherine of Alexandria holds the rim of the broken spiked wheel on which the first attempt to kill her failed. (When Catherine touched the wheel, it broke. So, they eventually beheaded her.) St. Sebastian holds the arrows that were shot into his body.

Most of us are not called to the kind of martyrdom that these saints experienced. However, while we may not be called to a "red" martyrdom, all of us are called to a "white" martyrdom. The word "martyr" comes from the Greek "μαρτυρώ" ("martyro") which means "to testify". So, each of us is called to testify or to witness to the faith, either by dying for it (red martyrdom) or by some other way (white martyrdom). As Our Lord said in Matthew 25, we testify to our faith through our words and actions. We testify to our faith by feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, caring for the sick and the dying and visiting the imprisoned. We carry out these actions not also literally, but also figuratively. For example, not all of us are able to physically visit those in prison or jail, but we can always pray for them. When we bring the incarcerated to mind as we pray a Rosary, we are "visiting" them. Or, we may know someone who is not in a physical prison, but is imprisoned by a particular addiction or weakness. We can accompany our friend or relative and help him or her choose a path to healing.

After we die, what instrument or object will each of us be associated with? It may not be a wool comb or a spiked wheel, but perhaps it will be an apron because one enjoys cooking and bringing others together through a good meal. Maybe it will be a shield, because one helped

bring peace to a city and a neighborhood through one's work as a peace officer. Maybe one will be depicted with a book, because in one's teaching one brought others to God. Maybe you will have a smart phone in our hand, because you used the phone to give greater honor and glory to God and helped others to be saints. The possibilities are endless and as different from each other as each of us is different from each other. We pray that each of us finds the instrument that God wants us to use to bring others to our Lord Jesus Christ and to help prepare ourselves for our ultimate destination which is heaven.

# NUESTRO SEÑOR JESUCRISTO, REY DEL UNIVERSO

El Hijo del Hombre se sentará en su glorioso trono y los separará unos de otros (Mateo 25:31-46).



## DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

¡Hemos llegado al último domingo del año litúrgico! En este domingo, la Iglesia siempre honra a Nuestro Señor Jesus Cristo Rey. Este año, el Evangelio es del vigésimo quinto Capítulo del Evangelio de San Mateo, donde nuestro Señor habla de Su venida en gloria y del Juicio Final. Por seguro que es una lectura solemnizadora. En la lectura, los justos le preguntan al Rey, quien representa a Nuestro Señor y Dios: "¿Señor, ¿cuándo te vimos hambriento o sediento o forastero o desnudo o enfermo o en la cárcel, y no te asistimos?" Ojalá podamos dar una respuesta positiva a cada uno de estas preguntas.

La imagen en frente del boletín de este fin de semana es una pequeña sección detallada de Michelangelo de "El Juicio Final" que se encuentra en la Capilla Sixtina del Vaticano. La imagen representa a San Blas, Santa Caterina de Alejandría y San Sebastián. Cada santo es representado con el instrumento con el cual cada santo fue martirizado. Así pues, San Blas se muestra con los cepillos con los que su carne fue rastrillada antes de ser decapitado. Santa Caterina de Alejandría sostiene el borde de la rueda rota en la que el primer intento para matarla fracasó. (Cuando Caterina tocó la rueda, se rompió. Por lo tanto, finalmente la decapitaron.) San Sebastián sostiene las flechas con las que le dispararon a su cuerpo.

La mayoría de nosotros no somos llamados al mismo tipo de martirio que estos santos experimentaron. Sin embargo, aunque no seamos llamados a un martirio "rojo", todos estamos llamados a un martirio "blanco". La palabra "mártir" proviene del griego "μαρτυρόν" ("mártir") que significa "testificar". Por lo tanto, cada uno de nosotros estamos llamados a testificar la fe, ya sea muriendo por ella (martirio rojo) o de alguna otra manera (martirio blanco). Como nuestro Señor dijo en Mateo 25, damos testimonio de nuestra fe a través de nuestras palabras y acciones. Testificamos nuestra fe alimentando al hambriento, dando beber al forastero, vistiendo al desnudo, cuidando al enfermo y visitando al moribundo y al encarcelado. Llevamos a cabo estas acciones no solo literalmente, sino también en sentido figurado. Por ejemplo, no todos podemos visitar físicamente a los que están en prisión o en la cárcel, pero podemos orar por ellos. Cuando nos acordamos de los encarcelados mientras rezamos un Rosario, los estamos "visitando". O, puede ser que conozcamos a alguien que no está en una prisión físicamente, pero está encarcelado por una adicción o debilidad en particular. Podemos acompañar a nuestro amigo o pariente y ayudarlo a elegir el camino hacia la sanación.

Después de la muerte, ¿con qué instrumento u objeto se nos asociará a cada quién? Puede que no sea un cepillo para lana o una rueda con púas, pero tal vez sea con un delantal porque la persona disfruta cocinar y reunir a los demás a través de una buena comida. Tal vez sea un escudo, porque la persona ayudó a traer la paz a una ciudad y vecindario a través de su trabajo como oficial de paz. Tal vez la persona sea representada con un libro, porque en su enseñanza acerca al prójimo a Dios. Tal vez usted tendrá un teléfono inteligente en su mano, porque usted utilizó el teléfono para dar gran honor y gloria a Dios y ayudó a los demás a alcanzar la santidad. Las posibilidades son infinitas y diferentes entre sí como cada uno de nosotros somos diferentes el uno del otro. Oremos para que cada uno de nosotros encontremos el instrumento que Dios quiere que usemos para llevar a los demás a nuestro Señor Jesucristo y para ayudarnos a estar preparados para nuestro destino final que es el cielo.

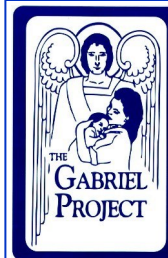
