

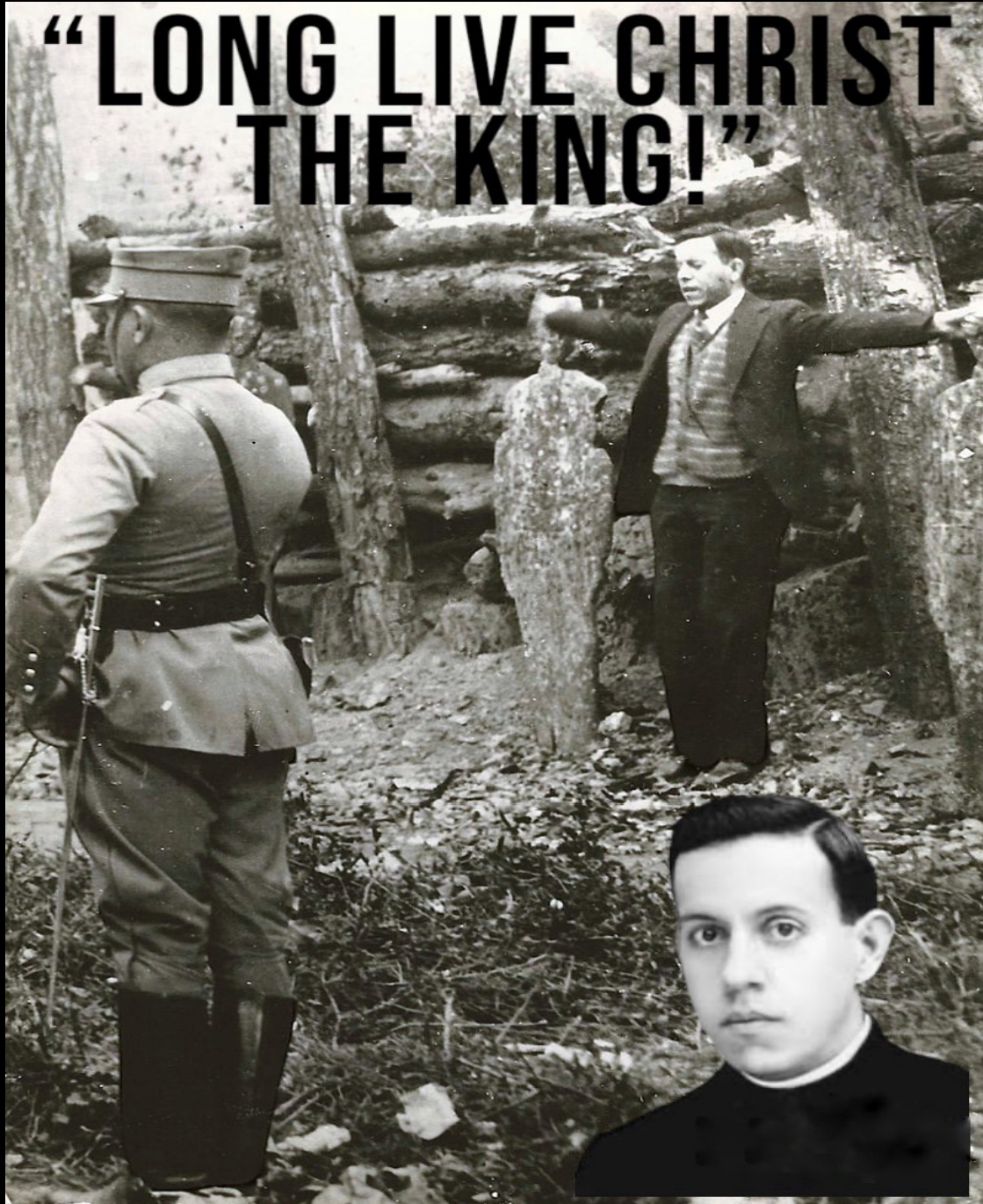

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

It's 1927. Life in Mexico is changing for the worse; it's revolutionary-like. The Mexican authorities have adopted a vehemently anti-Catholic approach. Their main goal – destroy the Catholic Church in the hearts of the people. During this time, over 90% of them would have identified their Catholic faith as integral to their identity. It was the center of their lives. The Church baptized their children, they were educated in our schools, they married within the walls of the Church, they went to Catholic hospitals when they were sick and they called the priests when they were dying. To be Mexican was to be Catholic; the two were intertwined for nearly five centuries.

The government of the then president Plutarco Elias Calles, sought to change this by any means necessary. The question for him had become, "How do I kill the faith of the Mexican people?" Under his leadership, the fiercest persecution against the Catholic Church would begin. Our Catholic brothers and sisters did not cower in fear. In fact, they fought back. One of these men was a faithful priest by the name of Fr. Miguel Pro. He defied the government mandates and secretly ministered to the people. He baptized, he married couples, he taught them catechesis; he did all the things that a good, faithful priest would do. The police looked for him for months until one day they finally found this "irritating" priest.

The photo on the bulletin cover is of Fr. Miguel Pro in one of disguises was taken in 1927, shortly before he died by firing squad. His captors asked him if he had any last words. He raised both hands in the form of a cross and yelled, "LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING!" The government published this photo on the front pages of all the major newspapers the next day in an attempt to scare Catholics. It had the opposite effect.

Dethroning our egos is the hardest part of being a follower of Jesus Christ. Every day we must decide again and again that Jesus Christ is the King of our lives. Last Sunday at the 10AM Mass, we officially welcomed the largest group OCIA class in recent parish memory (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults). These brothers and sisters of ours are seeking to enter fully into the Catholic Church.

They each received the Sign of the Cross on their foreheads by me, as well as the sign of the cross on their ears, eyes, lips, hearts, shoulders, hands and feet from their sponsors. They also received a Bible and a crucifix to wear around their necks as the sign of God's love.

SOLEMNIDAD DE NUESTRO SEÑOR JESUCRISTO, REY DEL UNIVERSO

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María,

Es 1927. La vida en México cambia para peor; era parecido a una revolución. Las autoridades mexicanas han adoptado un enfoque intensamente anticatólico. Su objetivo principal: destruir la Iglesia Católica en los corazones de la gente. Durante este tiempo, más del 90% del pueblo habían identificado su fe católica como parte integral de su identidad. Era el centro de sus vidas. La Iglesia bautizaba a sus hijos, se educaban en nuestras escuelas, se casaban dentro de los muros de la Iglesia, iban a los hospitales católicos cuando estaban enfermos y llamaban a los sacerdotes cuando agonizaban. Ser mexicano era ser católico; los dos estaban entrelazados durante casi cinco siglos.

El gobierno del entonces presidente Plutarco Elías Calles, buscó cambiar esto por todos los medios necesarios. La pregunta para él se había convertido en: "¿Cómo elimino la fe del pueblo mexicano?" Bajo su liderazgo comenzaría la persecución más feroz contra la Iglesia Católica. Todos los sacerdotes misioneros extranjeros fueron expulsados del país. Nuestras escuelas se cerraron. Clavaron las puertas de madera de nuestras iglesias para cerrarlas, convirtiendo la Misa dominical en una actividad ilegal. No se les permitía a los sacerdotes y monjas usar sus hábitos y sotanas en público; si lo hacían, eran arrestados.

Nuestros hermanos y hermanas católicos no se acobardaban con miedo. De hecho, se defendieron. Uno de estos hombres era un sacerdote fiel llamado Padre Miguel Pro. El Padre Pro desafió los mandatos del gobierno y sirvió en secreto a la gente. Bautizaba, casaba parejas, les enseñaba catequesis; hizo todas las cosas que haría un buen y fiel sacerdote. La policía lo buscó durante meses hasta que un día finalmente encontraron a este sacerdote "fastidioso".

La foto de la portada del boletín es del Padre Miguel Pro en uno de sus disfraces, fue tomada en 1927, poco antes de morir fusilado. Sus captores le preguntaron si tenía unas últimas palabras. Levantó ambas manos en forma de cruz y gritó: "¡VIVA CRISTO REY!" El gobierno publicó esta foto en las portadas de todos los periódicos importantes al día siguiente en un intento de asustar a los católicos. Tuvo el efecto contrario.

Destronar nuestros egos es la parte más difícil de ser seguidor de Jesucristo. Cada día debemos decidir una y otra vez que Jesucristo es el Rey de nuestras vidas. El domingo pasado, en la Misa de las 10am, dimos oficialmente la bienvenida al grupo de clase OCIA más grande en la que se sepa memoria parroquial reciente (Orden de Iniciación Cristiana para Adultos). Estos hermanos y hermanas nuestros buscan entrar de lleno en la Iglesia Católica.

Cada uno de ellos recibió la Señal de la Cruz en la frente de mi parte, así como la señal de la cruz en las orejas, ojos, labios, corazones, hombros, manos y pies de parte de sus padrinos. También recibieron una Biblia y un crucifijo para llevar alrededor del cuello como señal del amor de Dios.
