FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

Merry Christmas! With the arrival of December 25th, we make the switch from the season of Advent to Christmastide when the Church gives us a couple of weeks to reflect upon the gift of the Incarnation. As always, the Church's liturgical calendar is a wonderful teacher. By situating the Solemnity of the Holy Family on the first Sunday after Christmas Day, we are reminded that that if the Nativity of the Lord is a celebration of God coming to us as a Child, Christmas also reminds us of the gift of the Holy Family and the importance of the human family. The opening Collect for Mass puts it this way: "O God, who were pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity...."

During Christmas season, baby Jesus and Mother Mary receive a fair amount of rightly deserved attention. Still, we have much to learn from St. Joseph. We have all heard that not one word of Joseph is recorded in Sacred Scripture. Nonetheless, Joseph speaks much through his actions. What were some of Joseph's actions? For one thing, different from Mary, Joseph was not told from the beginning that he was going to be the father to the Son of God. We remember that when Joseph first found out Mary was pregnant, he was thinking of divorcing her quietly. Later, while sleeping, an angel clarified things for him. The angel told Joseph not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife and that she had conceived Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. Clearly, Joseph had a deep spiritual life which enabled to discern clearly something communicated to him from God. And, he had the conviction and confidence to act on it.

Regarding his unique union with Mary, Joseph chose marriage freely even though he must have known that his choice would require him to remain celibate. Joseph's obedient promise to God to live as the celibate husband of Mary did not make him a weaker man. Indeed, it made him all the more manly. Through their chaste self-mastery, Joseph and Mary exemplify how to live in control of one's desires and appetites, indeed, to live obediently according to God's will with the help of His grace. This is a very important lesson. We live in a world that hammers us with the message that it is not possible to control one's bodily, sexual or emotional appetites. Therefore, we should just give in to them, we are told. Jesus, Mary and Joseph teach us otherwise.

St. Joseph reminds us of another truth: it is not the biological fatherhood of the father of the family that is most important. Nor is fatherhood primarily about equipping one's children for success in the world. Indeed, on account of his *not* being Jesus's biological father, Joseph reminds us of the more important dimension of fatherhood. As the legal

father of Jesus, it was Joseph's duty to raise Our Lord in the traditions and faith of Israel. It would have been Joseph's role to teach Jesus how to pray, to bring him to the synagogue and to familiarize him with Sacred Scripture. Today, many fathers today think it is good enough to provide for one's family and to give advice on how to get ahead in the world. But, it is important to remember that the Church has always taught that the father is the spiritual leader of the family. It is part and parcel of the father's fatherhood and therefore his manhood, to lead his wife and children to greater holiness through his own example and very intentional leadership. (cf. Rev. We pray that we "may imitate constantly the example of the Holy Family, so that after the trials of this world, we may share their company forever". (Prayer after Communion, Mass for the Solemnity of the Holy Family) Blessed Christmas!

LA SAGRADA FAMILIA DE JESÚS, MARÍA Y JOSÉ

José y María encuentran a Jesús perdido en el templo en medio de los maestros, escuchando y haciendo preguntas (Lucas 2:41-52).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María,

¡Feliz Navidad! Con la llegada del 25 de diciembre, hacemos el cambio de la temporada de Adviento a la temporada Navideña cuando la Iglesia nos da un par de semanas para reflexionar sobre el don de la Encarnación. Como siempre, el calendario litúrgico de la Iglesia es un maravilloso maestro. Al situar la Solemnidad de la Sagrada Familia el primer domingo después del día de Navidad, se nos recuerda que, si la Natividad del Señor es una celebración de Dios que viene a nosotros como un bebé, la Navidad también nos recuerda el don de la Sagrada Familia y la importancia de la familia humana. La oración Colecta para la Misa lo expresa de esta manera: "Señor Dios, que te dignaste dejarnos el más perfecto ejemplo en la Sagrada Familia de tu Hijo, concédenos benignamente que, imitando sus virtudes domesticas y los lazos de caridad que la unió..."

Durante la temporada Navideña, el niño Jesús y la Madre María reciben una buena cantidad de atención justamente merecida. Aun así, tenemos mucho que aprender de San José. Todos hemos escuchado que ni una sola palabra de José está registrada en la Sagrada Escritura. Sin embargo, José habla mucho a través de sus acciones. ¿Cuáles fueron algunas de las acciones de José? Por un lado, a diferencia de María, a José no se le dijo desde el principio que iba a ser el padre del Hijo de Dios. Recordamos que cuando José se enteró por primera vez de que María estaba embarazada, estaba pensando en divorciarse de ella silenciosamente. Más tarde, mientras dormía, un ángel le aclaró las cosas. El ángel le dijo a José que no tuviera miedo de tomar a María como su esposa y que ella había concebido a Jesús por obra del Espíritu Santo. Claramente, José tenía una profunda vida espiritual que le permitía discernir claramente algo que Dios le comunicaba. Y tenía la convicción y la confianza para actuar en eso.

Con respecto a su unión única con María, José eligió el matrimonio libremente a pesar de que debió haber sabido que su elección requeriría que permaneciera célibe. La promesa obediente de José a Dios de vivir como el esposo célibe de María no lo convirtió en un hombre más débil. De hecho, lo hizo aún más varonil. A través de su casto autodomínio, José y María ejemplifican cómo vivir en control de los deseos y apetitos de uno, de hecho, para vivir obedientemente de acuerdo con la voluntad de Dios con la ayuda de Su gracia. Esta es una lección muy importante. Vivimos en un mundo que nos golpea con el

mensaje de que no es posible controlar los apetitos corporales, sexuales o emocionales. Por lo tanto, debemos ceder ante ellos, se nos dice. Jesús, María y José nos enseñan lo contrario.

San José nos recuerda otra verdad: no es la paternidad biológica del padre de la familia lo más importante. Tampoco la paternidad se trata principalmente de equipar a los hijos para triunfar en el mundo. De hecho, debido a que *no* es el padre biológico de Jesús, José nos recuerda la dimensión más importante de la paternidad. Como el padre legal de Jesús, era el deber de José educar a Nuestro Señor en las tradiciones y la fe de Israel. Habría sido el papel de José enseñar a Jesús a orar, llevarlo a la sinagoga y familiarizarlo con la Sagrada Escritura. Hoy en día, muchos padres piensan que es lo suficiente mantener a la familia y dar consejos sobre cómo salir adelante en el mundo. Pero, es importante recordar que la Iglesia siempre ha enseñado que el padre es el líder espiritual de la familia. Es parte y encomienda de la paternidad del padre y, por lo tanto, de su hombría, llevar a su esposa e hijos a una mayor santidad a través de su propio ejemplo y un liderazgo muy intencional. (cf.
