FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

This weekend, you will notice that the statues and crucifix are covered with cloth. The option of "veiling" is found in the instructions in the *Roman Missal* for the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The instruction notes: "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil."

There are a number of reasons that the liturgical norms allow for veiling the crucifix and images during the last couple weeks of Lent. In his book, "Celebrations of the Liturgical Year". Bishop Elliot writes: "The custom of veiling crosses and images.....has much to commend it in terms of religious psychology, because it helps us to concentrate on the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption." In other words, the veils help remind us that we are in a special time of the liturgical year. When we see the veils, we cannot help but realize that something is very different. As second reason for the veiling is that it helps us to concentrate on the words being proclaimed, prayed and preached at Mass. For example, when we reflect on the Passion accounts on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, we can enter into the scene and really picture it in our minds. A third reason is that the veiling whets our spiritual appetite for Easter Sunday. We miss seeing the images and so we anticipate when we will be able to see them again. When the veils are removed before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded of our life in this world. Our life in this world is a preparation for our true homeland, which is heaven. In this life, we cannot know what heaven is like. It is hidden and mysterious to us. It is veiled. Through our passing from this life to the next, the veil will be lifted and we will see the beauty of our earthly lives. (cf. It seems that the origins of the practice of covering statues in Lent date from the ninth century in Germany, when a large cloth would be extended before the altar from the beginning of Lent. This cloth, called the "Hungertuch" (hunger cloth), hid the altar entirely from the faithful during Lent but was removed during Passiontide, the last two weeks of Lent. Later, the practice of covering the statues and the crucifix evolved to limiting it to the last two weeks of Lent. In any case, be assured that the cloths will be removed before the Easter Vigil. Until then, we "hunger" to see our beloved statues again and walk with Jesus through the darkness of his Passion.

QUINTO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

21 de marzo de 2021

Si el grano de trigo cae en tierra y muere, da mucho fruto (Juan 12:20-33) o Juan 11:1-45



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa Maria:

Este fin de semana, notarán que las estatuas y el crucifijo están cubiertos con un velo. La opción de "cubrir" se encuentra en las instrucciones de la *Misal Romano* para el Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma. La instrucción señala: "La costumbre de cubrir las cruces y las imágenes de la iglesia desde este domingo puede conservarse. Las cruces permanecerán cubiertas hasta después de la celebración de la Pasión del Señor, el Viernes Santo, y las imágenes hasta el comienzo de la Vigilia pascual."

Hay una serie de razones por las que las normas litúrgicas permiten cubrir el crucifijo y las imágenes durante las últimas dos semanas de Cuaresma. En su libro, "Celebraciones del Año Litúrgico". El obispo Elliot escribe: "La costumbre de cubrir cruces e imágenes...tiene mucho que alabar en términos de psicología religiosa, porque nos ayuda a concentrarnos en los grandes elementos esenciales de la obra de Redención de Cristo". En otras palabras, las coberturas nos recuerdan que estamos en un momento especial del año litúrgico. Cuando vemos las coberturas, no podemos evitar darnos cuenta de que algo es muy diferente. Como segunda razón por la cobertura es que nos ayuda a concentrarnos en las palabras que se proclaman, se rezan y predicadas en la Misa. Por ejemplo, cuando reflexionamos sobre los relatos de Pasión durante el Domingo de Ramos y el Viernes Santo, podemos entrar en la escena y realmente imaginarlo en nuestras mentes. Una tercera razón es que las coberturas despiertan nuestro apetito espiritual por el Domingo de Pascua. Echamos de menos ver las imágenes y por eso anticipamos cuándo podremos volver a verlas de nuevo. Cuando se quitan los velos antes de la Vigilia pascual, se nos recuerda nuestra vida en este mundo. Nuestra vida en este mundo es una preparación para nuestra verdadera patria, la cual es el cielo. En esta vida, no podemos saber cómo es el cielo. Es oculto y misterioso para nosotros. Está cubierto. A través de nuestro paso de esta vida a la siguiente, el velo será levantado y veremos la belleza de nuestras vidas terrenales. (cf. "¿Por qué los católicos cubren estatuas y crucifijos durante la Cuaresma", ¿Por qué en Cuaresma se cubren crucifijos y estatuas? (aleteia.org)

Parece que los orígenes de la práctica de cubrir estatuas en Cuaresma datan del siglo IX en Alemania, cuando una gran tela se extendía ante el altar desde el comienzo de la Cuaresma. Esta tela, llamada "Hungertuch" (tela de hambre), escondía el altar completamente de los fieles durante la Cuaresma, pero se quitaba durante la Pasión, las últimas dos semanas de Cuaresma. Más tarde, la práctica de

cubrir las estatuas y el crucifijo evolucionó a limitarlo a las últimas dos semanas de Cuaresma. De cualquier forma, tenga por seguro de que las telas se quitarán antes de la Vigilia Pascual. Hasta entonces, "tenemos hambre" de volver a ver nuestras queridas estatuas y caminar con Jesús a través de la oscuridad de su Pasión.
