

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

Although I had my cell phone set to vibrate, the persistent, annoying vibrating of the phone on my dresser woke me up at 4:05 am on Wednesday morning, August 19th. It was Andreya Arevalo, St. Mary's Youth Minister, calling to let me know that her family had been ordered to evacuate and to warn Fr. Steven and me that we may be required to evacuate as well. The Arevalo's live in the area of town west of Orchard and north of Hemlock, part of the area that was under mandatory evacuation orders in the early morning hours of August 19th. As everyone knows by now, the fires that had been ignited by the dry lightning storms the previous weekend had been fanned by strong winds and had grown considerably overnight. Homes along Pleasants Valley Road, in English Hills and around Lake Berryessa---basically the area west of Gibson Canyon Road and north of Vaca Valley Road between here and Winters---were being evacuated immediately.

Although St. Mary's Church was not in the mandatory evacuation zone, I felt that Fr. Steven and I needed to be ready to leave if necessary. I woke up Fr. Steven and we began to gather together important parish, church and personal things and pack them into our cars. It was hard to know what to pack when time was short and there was so much to pack. We gathered vestments, vessels, liturgical books, computers, the sacramental registers and other important documents. We gathered personal clothes and bicycles (mine). We decided to leave the Blessed Sacrament for last. For sure, we would take the Sacrament with us, but we decided we would wait to see if we would be required to evacuate. Around 7a, I decided I might as well pray, so I went into the church to make my daily hour. At 8a, Fr. Steven and I decided to celebrate Mass, as scheduled, and a few parishioners joined us. It seemed like the right thing to do. When one's world is being turned upside down, prayer is more important than anything.

To be sure, peace and tranquility and trust in God in anxious times have been a theme in the Mass readings lately. Three Sundays ago, on August 9th, we reflected on the apostles in the boat during the storm and Our Lord walking calmly on the water to join them. Two days before the evacuations, at daily Mass, we had the Gospel reading of the young rich man who "went away sad, for he had many possessions". In my brief homily, I mentioned the folks in Paradise who had barely escaped the Camp Fire in 2018 with the clothes on their backs and very little possessions. It is one thing to speak theoretically about these things, but quite another to experience them first hand as many of you did. On the night of the initial evacuation, parishioners who were in the evacuation zone spoke of

seeing the red glow behind the hills to the west of Vacaville. They anxiously grabbed things to take with them, in the dark since the power was out. Not knowing whether or not one's home would survive the fires, they were understandably very anxious.

In the aftermath of the evacuations, a number of parishioners have reported that their homes are still standing. A few have reported that they lost everything. (While the house and the pavilion at the Caligiuri ranch on Cantelow were spared, the barn was not.) We are in the process of reaching out to folks and seeing how we can be of assistance. Please don't hesitate to call us, if you need anything at all. Above all, let us keep each in prayer during this time. We pray for all those who have suffered loss on account of the fires. We pray for those fighting the fires and for an end to the fires. And, we pray for an end to the pandemic. Above all, we pray that God have mercy on us all.

Si quieres seguirme, renuncia a ti mismo, carga con tu cruz y sígueme (Mateo 16:21-27).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

Aunque tenía mi teléfono celular en vibrador, la vibración persistente y molesta del teléfono en mi cómoda me despertó a las 4:05am del miércoles por la mañana del 19 de agosto. Era Andreya Arévalo, Ministro de Jóvenes de la Parroquia de Santa María, llamando para dejarme saber que su familia había sido ordenada a evacuar y para advertirnos al Padre Steven y a mí que tal vez íbamos a tener que evacuar también. Los Arévalo viven en la zona de la ciudad al oeste de Orchard y al norte de Hemlock, parte de la zona que estaba bajo órdenes de evacuación obligatoria por la madrugada del 19 de agosto. Como ya todos saben, los incendios que habían comenzado por las tormentas de rayos el fin de semana anterior se habían desatado a causa de los fuertes vientos y habían crecido considerablemente de la noche a la mañana. Casas a lo largo de Pleasants Valley Road, en English Hills y alrededor de Lake Berryessa--- básicamente la zona al oeste de Gibson Canyon Road y al norte de Vaca Valley Road entre aquí y Winters--- estaban siendo evacuadas inmediatamente.

Aunque la Iglesia de Santa María no estaba en la zona de evacuación obligatoria, sentí que el Padre Steven y yo necesitábamos estar listos para salir rápidamente si fuera necesario. Desperté al Padre Steven y comenzamos a reunir cosas importantes de la parroquia, la iglesia y las cosas personales y a subirlas en nuestros autos. Fue difícil saber qué empacar cuando el tiempo era corto y había tanto que empaçar. Reunimos las vestimentas, cáliz, libros litúrgicos, computadoras, los libros de registros sacramentales y otros documentos importantes. Reunimos ropa personal y bicicletas (la mía). Decidimos dejar el Santísimo Sacramento para el final. Por seguro que llevaríamos el Sacramento con nosotros, pero decidimos esperar a ver si tendríamos que evacuar. Alrededor de las 7am, decidí que podría orar, así que fui a la iglesia para hacer mi hora diaria. A las 8am, el Padre Steven y yo decidimos celebrar la Misa, como estaba previsto, y algunos feligreses nos acompañamos. Parecía lo correcto de hacer. Cuando el mundo está de cabeza, la oración es más importante que nunca.

Sin duda, la paz y la tranquilidad y la confianza en Dios en tiempos de ansiedad han sido un tema en las lecturas de la Misa últimamente. Hace tres domingos, el 9 de agosto, reflexionamos sobre los apóstoles en el barco durante la tormenta y nuestro Señor caminando tranquilamente sobre las aguas para unirse con ellos. Dos días antes de las evacuaciones, en la Misa diaria, tuvimos la lectura evangélica del joven rico que "se fue triste, porque tenía muchos bienes". En mi breve homilía, mencioné a la gente en Paradise

que en cuanto pudo escapar del Incendio Camp del 2018 con la ropa que traían puesta y muy pocas posesiones. Una cosa es hablar teóricamente sobre estas cosas, pero otra muy diferente experimentarlas de primera mano como muchos de ustedes lo hicieron. La noche de la evacuación inicial, los feligreses que estaban en la zona de evacuación comentaban que veían el resplandor rojo detrás de los cerros al oeste de Vacaville. Ansiosamente juntaron cosas para llevarse con ellos, en la oscuridad ya que no había electricidad. Sin saber si la casa de uno sobreviviría o no a los incendios, era lógico que estuviera tan ansiosos.

Después de las evacuaciones, varios feligreses han informado de que sus hogares siguen en pie. Algunos han informado de que lo perdieron todo. (Mientras que la casa y el pabellón en el rancho Caligiuri en Cantelow se han salvado, el granero no.) Estamos en el proceso de contactar a la gente afectada para ver cómo le podemos ayudar. Por favor, no dude en llamarnos, si necesita cualquier cosa. Se puede comunicar por correo electrónico: office@stmarysvacaville.com o por teléfono al 707-448-2390 de lunes a viernes de las 9am – 1pm. Sobre todo, mantengamos cada uno en oración durante este tiempo. Oremos por todos aquellos que han sufrido pérdidas a causa de los incendios. Oramos por aquellos que luchan contra los incendios y por el fin de los incendios. Y oremos por el fin de la pandemia. Sobre todo, oramos para que Dios tenga misericordia de todos nosotros.

SAN GREGORIO MAGNO (540-604) 3 de septiembre

Gregorio nació en Roma, donde posteriormente cursó estudios de Derecho, llegando a ser Prefecto de la ciudad a los 34 años. No obstante su éxito, a la muerte de su padre, se dedicó a la construcción de conventos, haciendo de su casa uno de ellos. Abraza la vida de monasterio y a los 35 años es ordenado diácono y enviado como representante papal a la actual Turquía. Volvió a Roma como secretario del Papa Plagio II, y a su muerte, fue escogido unánimemente por el clero como el obispo de Roma. Como tal, dio firmeza al papado independizándolo del Emperador, siendo el primer monje en llegar al papado, tenía un gran amor por la liturgia y decretó que se recopilaran los himnos antiguos de la cristiandad, llevando a cabo una reforma litúrgica y creando un Misal nuevo que combinaba varios ritos. Gracias a él se renovó el canto en la liturgia y en su honor, se le llamó canto gregoriano. Se le da el calificativo de Magno o Grande por la influencia de su papado así como de sus escritos.


