FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners,

In the Gospel for this Fourth Sunday, we see a big change in the people's reactions to Our Lord. Last Sunday, they were very pleased with Jesus, when he read from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah and said that the Scripture passage was being fulfilled in their hearing. In this Sunday's Gospel, the people tried to throw Our Lord off of a cliff. The people were furious with Jesus because he was saying that all people from all walks of life and from all nations will receive his saving message. Jesus would be a Savior not only to the Jews, but to all peoples. Maybe they thought they were the chosen people, and because of that, they were special. But Jesus was trying to broaden their horizons. The people in the synagogue believed Jesus was being blasphemous because he identified himself with Elijah and Elisha. For these reasons, they wanted to throw Jesus off the cliff outside of town.

To his listeners, Jesus was often a sign of contradiction. He came to "bring glad tidings to the poor," yet he ate with the wealthy. He would reprimand his disciples for being ambitious and he would call on the rich and powerful to be of service to the poor and the powerless. In other words, Jesus was always trying to get his listeners to consider their life in this world in light of their destiny. He wanted them to live for the kingdom of heaven. A fundamental quality of Jesus's priesthood was to move the people, through his words and actions, to consider their destiny, to realize the dignity to which they had been called, and to be sign of contradiction in this world.

The celibate priesthood and the consecrated life are vocations which are signs to people in this life of how things will be in the next life. One way a priest or a consecrated person is a sign pointing to heaven, at least in the Roman Catholic Church, is through the living of celibacy, because in heaven, there is no marriage. In the Gospel of Matthew (Mt 22:30), Jesus says that in heaven, there is no marriage. This does not mean that marital love ends in heaven. Rather, it means that there is no marriage in heaven the way there is here on earth. One reason there is no marriage in heaven is because there is no dying. Therefore, there is no need to replenish the human race. Another reason there is no marriage in heaven is that the human need we have for intimacy is fulfilled by God in the beatific vision.

In his "Theology of the Body," Pope John Paul II spoke of the "spousal meaning of the body." St. John Paul II said that God has placed in each one of us the inclination to live *with* and *for* another. In this life, generally, the spousal meaning of the body is lived in either marriage or the consecrated life (religious life and priesthood). Ultimately, however, this spousal meaning of the body is an expression of that longing that each of us has to be united eternally with God in heaven. Therefore, those who live consecrated celibacy are a sign to all God's people of how we will relate

to God and to each other in heaven.

The celibate priesthood and the consecrated life not only point to the kingdom of heaven, but they also point to Jesus Christ because He himself chose to live in virginity for the kingdom of heaven. Thus, the celibate priesthood and consecrated life are valued because Jesus chose to live this way himself. The consecrated celibate chooses to fashion his life in a very concrete way on the celibacy or virginity of Jesus. He or she makes the choice to follow God's call to celibacy with a very concrete understanding of what he or she is choosing. He or she needs to cultivate a very deep love for Christ whom he or she is choosing to follow. At the same time, he or she has a profound understanding and a deep appreciation of what he is not choosing. In other words, marriage is valued very much. You would have to question the one who feels called to celibacy who does not have an appreciation for marriage or who has never considered choosing the married state of life. We are very blessed in our parish to have two priests and three religious sisters (Sisters Adriana, Greycy and Laura) to be signs pointing to heaven and to Jesus Christ.

What does all this have to do with me one might ask? The answer is everything! If we want to get to heaven, it is good to have a concrete reminder in this world pointing to our destiny and pointing to Jesus Christ, our Savior. We need signs all the time. We might remember to stop at an intersection that was missing a stop sign, but then again, we might not. And what would happen? We would crash. So, the celibate priesthood and consecrated life are good reminders to us of our destiny. Please join me in praying for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Lord knows, we need them!

CUARTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

30 de enero de 2022

Cuando Jesús reclama que su misión salvífica es para todos los pueblos, los miembros de la sinagoga de Nazaret enfurecidos lo echan fuera (Lucas 4:21-30).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María,

En el Evangelio de este Cuarto Domingo, vemos un gran cambio en las reacciones de la gente hacia Nuestro Señor. El domingo pasado, estaban muy complacidos con Jesús, cuando leyó el Libro del Profeta Isaías y dijo que el pasaje de las Escrituras se estaba cumpliendo en su audiencia. En el Evangelio de este domingo, el pueblo trató de arrojar a Nuestro Señor por un precipicio. La gente estaba furiosa con Jesús porque él estaba diciendo que todas las personas de todos los ámbitos de la vida y de todas las naciones recibirán su mensaje salvador. Jesús sería un Salvador no sólo para los judíos, sino para todos los pueblos. Tal vez pensaron que eran el pueblo elegido, y debido a eso, eran especiales. Pero Jesús estaba tratando de ampliar sus horizontes. La gente en la sinagoga creía que Jesús estaba siendo blasfemo porque se identificaba con Elías y Eliseo. Por estas razones, querían arrojar a Jesús en el precipicio fuera de la ciudad.

Para sus oyentes, Jesús era a menudo un signo de contradicción. Vino a "traer buenas nuevas a los pobres", sin embargo, comía con los ricos. Reprendía a sus discípulos por ser ambiciosos y llamaba a los ricos y poderosos a servir a los pobres y desamparados. En otras palabras, Jesús siempre estaba tratando de hacer que sus oyentes tomaran en cuenta su vida en este mundo a vista de su destino. Él quería que vivieran para el reino de los cielos. Una cualidad fundamental del sacerdocio de Jesús era motivar a la gente, a través de sus palabras y acciones, a considerar su destino, a realizar la dignidad a la que habían sido llamados y a ser signo de contradicción en este mundo.

El sacerdocio célibe y la vida consagrada son vocaciones los cuales son signos para las personas en esta vida de cómo serán las cosas en la próxima vida. Una forma en la que un sacerdote o una persona consagrada es muestra que apunta al cielo, al menos en la Iglesia Católica Romana, es a través de la vida del celibato, porque en el cielo, no hay matrimonio. En el Evangelio de Mateo (Mt 22:30), Jesús dice que en el cielo no hay matrimonio. Esto no significa que el amor conyugal termine en el cielo. Más bien, significa que no hay matrimonio en el cielo de la manera en que lo hay aquí en la tierra. Una razón por la que no hay matrimonio en el cielo es porque no hay muerte. Por lo tanto, no hay necesidad de reponer la raza humana. Otra razón por la que no hay matrimonio en el cielo es que la necesidad humana que tenemos de intimidad se satisface por Dios en la visión beatífica.

En su "Teología del Cuerpo", el Papa Juan Pablo II

habló del "significado conyugal del cuerpo". San Juan Pablo II dijo que Dios ha puesto en cada uno de nosotros la inclinación a vivir *con* y *para* el otro. En esta vida, generalmente, el significado conyugal del cuerpo se vive en el matrimonio o en la vida consagrada (vida religiosa y sacerdocio). Básicamente, sin embargo, este significado conyugal del cuerpo es una expresión de ese anhelo que cada uno de nosotros tenemos estar unido eternamente con Dios en el cielo. Por lo tanto, aquellos que viven el celibato consagrado son una señal para todo el pueblo de Dios de cómo nos relacionaremos con Dios y entre nosotros en el cielo.

El sacerdocio célibe y la vida consagrada no sólo apuntan al reino de los cielos, sino que también apuntan a Jesucristo porque El mismo eligió vivir en virginidad para el reino de los cielos. Por lo tanto, el sacerdocio célibe y la vida consagrada son valorados porque Jesús eligió vivir de esta manera él mismo. El célibe consagrado elige moldear su vida de una manera muy concreta sobre el celibato o la virginidad de Jesús. Él o ella toma la decisión de seguir el llamado de Dios al celibato con un entendimiento muy concreto de lo que él o ella está eligiendo. Él o ella necesita cultivar un amor muy profundo por Cristo a quien está eligiendo seguir. Al mismo tiempo, él o ella tienen un profundo entendimiento y una profunda apreciación de lo que no están eligiendo. En otras palabras, el matrimonio se valora mucho. Tendrías que cuestionar a aquel que siente llamado al celibato, a quien no aprecia el matrimonio o que nunca ha considerado elegir la vida matrimonial. Somos muy bendecidos en nuestra parroquia al tener dos sacerdotes y tres hermanas religiosas (las hermanas Adriana, Greycy y Laura) al ser señales que apuntan al cielo y a Jesucristo.

¿Qué tiene que ver todo esto conmigo uno podría preguntarse? ¡La respuesta es todo! Si queremos llegar al cielo, es bueno tener un recordatorio concreto en este mundo que señale nuestro destino y señale a Jesucristo, nuestro Salvador. Necesitamos señales todo el tiempo. Es posible que recordemos detenernos en una intersección a la que le faltaba una señal de alto, pero de también, podríamos no hacerlo. ¿Y qué pasaría? Nos estrellaríamos. Por lo tanto, el sacerdocio célibe y la vida consagrada son buenos recordatorios para nosotros para nuestro destino. Por favor, únense a mí en oración por más vocaciones sacerdotales y a la vida religiosa. ¡Dios sabe, los necesitamos!
