FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

October is "Respect Life Month". Every October, the Church asks that we spend some time reflecting more intentionally on the gift and dignity of every life, from the youngest to the oldest. We pray especially for the most vulnerable among us who depend on the protection of others in order to live. One thinks of a pre-born child or an elderly disabled person. We think of the homeless on the street, sex-trafficking victims and the incarcerated. Regarding the importance of protecting and defending the vulnerable, during this "Year of St. Joseph," it is good to reflect on how St. Joseph was a protector and defender of the Holy Family and how we are called to imitate St. Joseph by protecting the vulnerable. In his 2020 Apostolic Letter, "With a Father's Heart," (*Patris Corde*) Pope Francis wrote of St. Joseph:

Arriving in Bethlehem and finding no lodging where Mary could give birth, Joseph took a stable and, as best he could, turned it into a welcoming home for the Son of God come into the world (cf. *Lk 2:6-7*). Faced with imminent danger from Herod, who wanted to kill the child, Joseph was warned once again in a dream to protect the child, and rose in the middle of the night to prepare the flight into Egypt (cf. *Mt 2:13-14*). Thirty-one years before "With a Father's Heart," in 1989, Pope John Paul II wrote "Guardian of the Redeemer," (*Redemptoris Custos*) in which he described all the ways that St. Joseph guarded Jesus, protected Mary and, thus, also continues to protect the Church. During this Year of St. Joseph, it would be good to read both of these beautiful documents.

As protectors and defenders of life, following the example of St. Joseph, it is good to take stock of what we might be doing to protect the vulnerable among us. Recently, along with several seminarians from St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, I prayed in front of a Planned Parenthood clinic in Redwood City. As always, we prayed for the mothers and fathers that go into the building and for the workers that work there. And, we prayed for the unborn children that they would be able to see the light of day. As we prayed the Rosary peacefully on the sidewalk, alongside the busy street, we received a certain amount of feedback from the passersby. Believe it or not, for the most part, the feedback was positive; we received positive

horn honks much more often than negative hand gestures. Still, I had to ask myself: am I doing enough? For me, the answer is "No". There is always more to do, as long as human life, in all its forms and conditions, is not fully respected and defended. For example, I know that I can certainly pray more. I can pray that we find better ways to reach out to abortion-vulnerable women and help and support them so that they can give birth to their children. I know that I can pray more fervently that we have civil and political leaders who are willing to defend the rights of the unborn and protect the born who are in vulnerable situations. I know that I can be more generous to those in need and be more intentional about praying for and ministering to those in jail and prison. How about you? What can you be doing more of or how can you improve how you protect and defend the dignity of human life? I invite you to reflect upon these questions this week and then do something concrete to protect the most vulnerable among us.

THE HUMANITY OF JESUS CHRIST

All three readings today support—each in its own way, of course—a reflection on the humanity of Jesus Christ and how that humanity played a key role in the drama of our salvation. Although not chosen specifically to coordinate with the other two readings, today's second reading does in fact carry forward the theme of Christ's humanity in a remarkable way. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews highlights the solidarity that exists between Jesus and us, precisely because in his human nature Jesus has known the same sufferings and testing that are our own experience. Because he can “sympathize with our weaknesses,” we can “approach the throne of grace to receive mercy.” For the author of Hebrews, the humanity of Jesus was an essential requirement for his redemptive death, as well as an invitation to us to find in Jesus someone with whom we can identify in our daily struggles.

VIGÉSIMO NOVENO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

El Hijo del Hombre ha venido a servir y a dar su vida como rescate por una muchedumbre (Marcos 10:35-45).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa Maria:

Octubre es el "Mes de Respeto por la Vida". Cada mes de octubre, la Iglesia pide que dediquemos un tiempo a reflexionar más intencionalmente sobre el don y la dignidad de cada vida, desde los más jóvenes hasta los más ancianos. Oramos especialmente por los más vulnerables entre nosotros quienes dependen de la protección de los demás para poder vivir. Uno piensa en un bebe antes de nacer o en una persona discapacitada de edad avanzada. Pensamos en los indigentes, las víctimas de trata de blancas y los encarcelados. En cuanto a la importancia de proteger y defender a los vulnerables, durante este "Año de San José", es bueno reflexionar sobre cómo San José fue protector y defensor de la Sagrada Familia y cómo estamos llamados a imitar a San José protegiendo a los más vulnerables. En su Carta Apostólica de 2020, "Con un Corazón de Padre", (Patris Corde) el Papa Francisco escribió sobre San José:

El cielo intervino confiando en la valentía creadora de este hombre, que cuando llegó a Belén y no encontró un lugar donde María pudiera dar a luz, se instaló en un establo y lo arregló hasta convertirlo en un lugar lo más acogedor posible para el Hijo de Dios que venía al mundo (cf. *Lc 2,6-7*). Ante el peligro inminente de Herodes, que quería matar al Niño, José fue alerta una vez más en un sueño para protegerlo, y en medio de la noche organizó la huida a Egipto (cf. *Mt 2,13-14*). (PC, 5)

Treinta y un años antes de "Con un Corazón de Padre", en 1989, el Papa Juan Pablo II escribió "Guardián del Redentor" (Redemptoris Custos) en el cual describió todas las formas en que San José protegió a Jesús, protegió a María y, por lo tanto, también continúa protegiendo a la Iglesia. Durante este Año de San José, sería bueno leer estos dos hermosos documentos.

Como protectores y defensores de la vida, siguiendo el ejemplo de San José, es bueno hacer un inventario de lo que podríamos estar haciendo para proteger a los vulnerables entre nosotros. Reciente-

mente, junto con varios seminaristas del Seminario de San Patricio en Menlo Park, oré frente a una clínica de Planned Parenthood en Redwood City. Como siempre, oramos por las madres y los padres que entran en ese edificio y por los trabajadores que trabajan allí. Y oramos por los niños que están por nacer para que puedan ver la luz del día. Mientras rezábamos el Rosario pacíficamente en la acera, junto a la concurrida calle, recibimos una cantidad de comentarios de los transeúntes. Créanlo o no, en la mayoría, las reacciones fueron positivas; recibimos sonidos positivos del claxon de los carros más a menudo que gestos negativos con las manos. Aún así, me tuve que preguntar: ¿estoy haciendo lo suficiente? Para mí, la respuesta es "No". Siempre hay más que hacer, mientras que la vida humana, en todas sus formas y condiciones, no sea plenamente respetada y defendida. Por ejemplo, sé que definitivamente puedo orar más. Puedo orar para que encontremos mejores maneras de apoyar a las mujeres vulnerables al aborto y ayudarlas para que puedan sus hijos puedan nacer. Sé que puedo orar con más fervor para que tengamos líderes civiles y políticos que estén dispuestos a defender los derechos de los no nacidos y proteger a los nacidos que se encuentran en situaciones vulnerables. Sé que puedo ser más generoso con los necesitados y ser más atento al orar y ministrar a los que están en la cárcel y la prisión. ¿Y ustedes? ¿Qué pueden estar haciendo más o cómo pueden mejorar la forma en que protegen y defienden la dignidad de la vida humana? Los invito a reflexionar sobre estas preguntas esta semana y luego hacer algo concreto para proteger a los más vulnerables entre nosotros.

LA HUMANIDAD DE JESUCRISTO

Las tres lecturas de hoy apoyan –cada una a su manera, por supuesto– una reflexión sobre la humanidad de Jesucristo y la forma en que la humanidad tuvo un papel clave en el drama de nuestra salvación. Aunque no fue seleccionada específicamente para coordinar con las otras dos lecturas, la segunda lectura de hoy, de hecho, continúa el tema de la humanidad de Cristo de una manera notable. El autor de la Carta a los Hebreos pone de relieve la solidaridad que existe entre Jesús y nosotros, precisamente porque en su naturaleza humana Jesús ha conocido los mismos sufrimientos y las pruebas que son parte de nuestra experiencia. Debido a que puede “compadecerse de nuestros sufrimientos” podemos “acercarnos al trono de la gracia para recibir misericordia”. Para el autor de Hebreos, la humanidad de Jesús era un requisito esencial para su muerte redentora, así como una invitación a que veamos en Jesús a alguien con el que podemos identificarnos en nuestras luchas diarias.
