FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

Perhaps, you have wondered about the passage from the Gospel of Luke where the angel told the shepherds on Christmas night: "And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." (Lk 2:12) If it was customary for parents to wrap their new-born children in swaddling clothes, what is the big deal? Why would that have been a sign to the shepherds? Well, a priest friend of mine did some research about this and he came up with the following explanation.

First, it is true that wrapping an infant in swaddling clothes was a Jewish custom at the time of Jesus. The swaddling clothes were bands of cloth, probably cotton, not really "clothes" as in a garment. Moreover, the custom was to wrap the infant in these strips of cloth after washing the body and anointing it in powdered salt. First the baby was laid on its back diagonally on a square sheet of this cotton cloth. After folding the cloth around the infant the shroud was tied with the ribbons. Then the baby was wrapped with his or her arms and legs close to the body with the "swaddling cloth". This binding prevented the baby from hurting himself by kicking or scratching or rolling over. It is likely that the Blessed Mother would have seen this swaddling process done in Nazareth. However, if not there, she surely would have seen it done by the midwives at the birth of John the Baptist.

Second, an internet blogger speculates (after hearing the explanation in a bible class), that that the priests of the temple would set aside strips from their used, embroidered, liturgical vestments to be given as a gift to their new-born Davidic king. If this was true, then perhaps Zechariah (who was a priest of the tribe of Levi) and Elizabeth, the parents of John the Baptist, gave these strips to Mary so that she could use them to wrap the Christ Child. Our Lady would have brought these precious bands with her for the census trip to Bethlehem, the city of David, in anticipation of the coming of the Christ Child.

Third, we recall that St. Luke recounts that the angel told the shepherds: "And this will be a sign for you: you will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." (Lk 2:12) The sign was not that the child was wrapped in swaddling clothes, but that the infant was wrapped in swaddling clothes *and placed in a manger*. The angel's words made sense to the shepherds because, at time of Our Lord, it was tradition that the shepherds would provide the "lambs without blemish" for the temple sacrifices in nearby Jerusalem. To protect the new-born lamb from blemish, as required by Judaic law, the shepherds would wrap the lamb in swaddling cloth and place it in a food trough or manger apart from the other sheep. This was indeed a sign to the shepherds! They would find the new-born Christ Child wrapped just like they wrapped their own precious lamb after its birth to set it aside for the temple sacrifice.

When Our Lord was wrapped in swaddling clothes as an Infant, this was His first binding. He was wrapped by His Mother in love. Jesus' second binding was when He was taken away by His enemies on the night before His crucifixion. Our Lord's hands were tied together by cords in the Garden of Gethsemane. The third binding was the bands that wrapped Him

in His funeral shroud. Mary removed the first bands of Our Lord's infancy. Jesus' executioners removed the ropes of the second binding so that He might carry the Cross of salvation. And, on Easter Sunday, the Glorified Christ Himself removed the cloths that bound His Body around His funeral shroud. "By His bruises we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5) And, by His bindings we are set free. In the account of the raising of Lazarus, we read: "The dead man [Lazarus] came out, his hands and feet bound with bandages, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, and let him go.'" (Jn 11:44) We sing in *Hark the Herald Angels Sing*: "Born that man no more may die; born to raise the sons of earth; born to give them second birth." We give thanks to God for the gift of the Incarnation and our Redemption and we pray: "Almighty ever-living God, who in the Nativity of the Son established the beginning and fulfillment of all religion, grant, we pray, that we may be numbered among those who belong to him, in whom is the fullness of human salvation." (Collect from Mass on Dec 31st)

Special Blessings

Some special blessings are coming up related to the Epiphany of the Lord (traditionally celebrated January 6)! After the 8:00 Mass **Tuesday, January 5**, Fr. Wood will bless Epiphany water. This ancient rite of the blessing of the waters, with its powerful prayers of exorcism, renders Epiphany Water more spiritually potent than 'ordinary' holy water. Bring along a jar or jug of water to be blessed for your family.

After the 8:00 Mass on Wednesday, January 6, Fr. Wood will bless other items traditionally blessed on the Epiphany: chalk, gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The faithful can have their items of gold blessed (such as wedding rings and rosaries), myrrh for medicinal use, and frankincense to be used for the Epiphany home blessing and other liturgical feasts, along with any other statues, candles, medals, etc

Finally, January 6 and the week following is the traditional time of year to have your home blessed by a priest. Please contact the parish office if you would like Fr. Wood or Fr. Berg to celebrate the annual blessing of your home and family.

LA SAGRADA FAMILIA DE JESÚS, MARÍA Y JOSÉ

27 de diciembre de 2020

María y José llevan a Jesús al templo para consagrarlo al Señor (Lucas 2:22-40 [22, 39-40]).



DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

Tal vez, se han preguntado sobre el pasaje del Evangelio de Lucas, donde el ángel dijo a los pastores en la Nochebuena: "Y esto os servirá de señal: hallaréis a un niño envuelto en pañales y acostado en un pesebre." (Lc 2, 12) Si era la costumbre que los padres envolvieran a sus hijos recién nacidos en pañales, ¿cuál es el problema? ¿Por qué habría sido una señal para los pastores? Bueno, un sacerdote amigo mío investigó sobre esto y se le ocurrió la siguiente explicación.

En primer lugar, es cierto que envolver a un bebé en pañales era una costumbre judía en la época de Jesús. La ropa de pañales eran tiras de tela, probablemente de algodón, no realmente "ropa" como una prenda vestir. Además, la costumbre era envolver al bebé en estas tiras de tela después de lavarle el cuerpo y untarle sal en polvo. El bebé se acostaba de espaldas, diagonalmente sobre una tela cuadrada de algodón. Después de doblar el pañal alrededor del bebé, el sudario se ataba con las cintas. Luego el bebé se envolvía con los brazos y las piernas pegadas al cuerpo con el "pañal". Esta envoltura impedía que el bebé se lastimara pateando, arañándose o rodando. Es probable que la Santísima Madre hubiera visto este proceso de como envolver en pañales en Nazaret. Sin embargo, si no fue allí, seguramente lo habría visto cuando lo hicieron las parteras en el nacimiento de Juan el Bautista.

En segundo lugar, un bloguero de Internet especula (después de escuchar la explicación en una clase de Biblia), que los sacerdotes del templo apartaban las tiras de sus vestiduras litúrgicas bordadas ya usadas para dárselas como regalo a su recién nacido rey Davidico. Si esto fuese cierto, entonces tal vez Zacarías (que era sacerdote de la tribu de Leví) e Isabel, los padres de Juan el Bautista, le dieron estas tiras a María para que pudiera usarlas para envolver al Niño Jesús. La Virgen habría traído consigo estas preciosas tiras para el viaje censal a Belén, la ciudad de David, en previsión de la venida del Niño Jesús.

En tercer lugar, recordamos que San Lucas relata que el ángel dijo a los pastores: "Y esto os servirá de señal: hallaréis a un niño envuelto en pañales y acostado en un pesebre" (Lc 2, 12) La señal no era que el niño estuviera envuelto en pañales, sino que el bebé estaba envuelto en pañales y acostado en un pesebre. Las palabras del ángel tenían sentido para los pastores porque, en la época de Nuestro Señor, era tradición que los pastores proporcionaran los "corderos sin mancha" para los sacrificios del templo en la cercana Jerusalén. Para proteger al cordero recién nacido de la mancha, como lo exige la ley judía, los pastores envolvían el cordero en una tela y lo colocaban en una cubeta de alimentos o pesebre aparte de las otras ovejas. ¡Esto era una señal para los pastores! Encontrarían al Niño Cristo recién nacido envuelto tal como envolvieron a su propio cordero precioso después de su nacimiento y así apartarlo para el sacrificio del templo.

Cuando Nuestro Señor fue envuelto en pañales como un Niño, esta fue Su primera atadura. Fue envuelto por Su Madre en el amor. La segunda atadura de Jesús fue cuando Sus enemigos lo

llevaron la noche antes de Su crucifixión. Las manos de nuestro Señor estaban atadas por cuerdas en el Monte de Getsemaní. La tercera atadura fueron las tiras que lo envolvieron en Su sudario fúnebre. María quitó las primeras tiras de la infancia de Nuestro Señor. Los verdugos de Jesús quitaron las cuerdas de la segunda atadura para que pudiera llevar la Cruz de salvación. Y, el Domingo de Resurrección, el mismo Cristo glorificado quitó las telas que ataron Su Cuerpo en el sudario fúnebre. "Por Sus llagas somos sanados." (Isaías 53:5) Y, por Sus ataduras, somos liberados. En el relato de la crianza de Lázaro, leemos: "Y el que había muerto salió, atadas las manos y los pies con vendas, y el rostro envuelto en un sudario. Jesús les dijo: Desatadle, y dejadle ir." (Jn 11:44) Cantamos en *Oid! Los Ángeles Mensajeros Cantan*: "Nacido para que el hombre ya no muera, Nacido para levantar a los hijos de la tierra, Nacido para que renazcan." Damos gracias a Dios por el don de la Encarnación y nuestra Redención y oremos: "Dios todopoderoso y eterno, que aceptaste que el nacimiento de tu Hijo halle su principio y perfección la virtud que nos une a ti, concédenos que seamos contados entre los escogidos de aquel en quien esta la plenitud de toda salvación humana." (Oración Colecta el 31 de diciembre)

Favor de registrarse en la oficina parroquial antes de asistir a la clase Pre-Bautismal.


