FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear St. Mary's Parishioners:

If this year has not been chaotic and anxiety-inducing enough living with the COVID-19 pandemic and experiencing the California wildfires, we also are participants in local and national elections. Voting in a political election is something that all eligible United States citizens 18 years old and older have the opportunity to do. (<https://www.usa.gov/who-can-vote>) Indeed, our Catholic faith teaches us that we are obligated to vote. (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, par. 2239 and 2240) And, as Catholics, we are obligated to make sure that we are informed about Catholic teaching. In particular with regard to our duty as voting citizens, it is important that our Catholic faith informs and forms us on how we vote on particular issues and particular candidates for office.

When it comes to voting, the main authoritative sources or Vatican documents we Catholics draw from are the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, Pope John Paul II's encyclical, "The Gospel of Life" and the 2002 document from the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith entitled, "Doctrinal Note on Some Questions Regarding the Participation of Catholics in Political Life". The United States bishops have also provided us with "Faithful Citizenship: A Guide to Political Participation" and the 1998 document "Living the Gospel of Life".

There are a number of excellent Catholic voter guides available that are based on the aforementioned documents. One of the guides that I have found helpful is the one entitled, "2020 Issues for Catholic Voters" on the "Women of Grace" website. This guide can be found here: https://www.womenofgrace.com/App_Uploads_Docs/Document/VotersGuide2020-Update2.pdf As "2020 Issues" points out there are some basic principles of which we should all be aware. These are the principles I touched on in the first paragraph. When it comes to navigating through candidates and issues, I find the distinction that the guide makes between "settled" and "prudential" issues very helpful. As the guide notes, an issue is "settled" when it involves rejecting an intrinsic evil. An issue is considered "prudential" because "when applying general principles to specific situations a variety of valid conclusions can be drawn". Moreover, and this is of utmost importance: "settled issues carry more weight for the Catholic voter than prudential issues". The following would be considered settled issues: abortion, euthanasia and assisted suicide, fetal stem cells and cloning, marriage, religious liberty and racism. The following are prudential issues: health care, death penalty, war and peace, poverty, immigration, education, population, judiciary, economics, taxation and environment. Since settled issues carry more weight than prudential issues, it is important to carefully

consider a candidate's stand on the settled issues when discerning how to vote. Moreover, it is important to keep in mind the settled issues when discerning how to vote on particular issues.

While this column does not allow me the space to go into more detail for each of these settled and prudential issues, I highly recommend that you look up the guide yourselves, read it and study it. It is clear, precise and relatively easy to understand, even for someone like me who would much rather talk about sports than politics! May God guide us this November so that we choose civil leaders and vote on issues according to His will and for His greater honor and glory.

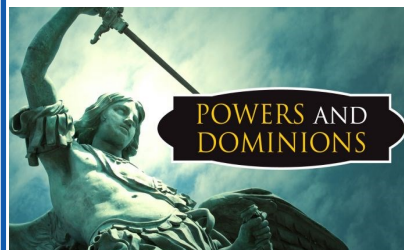

Estimados Feligreses de Santa María:

Si este año no ha sido lo suficientemente caótico y causante de ansiedad viviendo con la pandemia por el COVID-19 y los incendios forestales en California, también somos participantes en las elecciones locales y nacionales. Votar en una elección política es algo que todos los ciudadanos elegibles de los Estados Unidos mayores de 18 años tenemos la oportunidad de hacer. (<https://www.usa.gov/espanol/derecho-a-votar>) De hecho, nuestra fe católica nos enseña que tenemos la obligación de votar. (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, par. 2239 y 2240) Y, como católicos, tenemos la obligación de asegurarnos de estar informados sobre la enseñanza católica. En particular, con respecto a nuestro deber como ciudadanos votantes, es importante que nuestra fe católica nos informe y nos forme en cómo votamos sobre temas y candidatos en particular.

Cuando se trata de votar, las principales fuentes autorizadas o documentos vaticanos que los católicos extraemos son el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, la encíclica del Papa Juan Pablo II, "El Evangelio de la Vida" y el documento de 2002 de la Congregación para la Doctrina de la Fe titulado, "Nota Doctrinal Sobre Algunas Cuestiones Relativas al Compromiso y la Conducta de los Católicos en la Vida Política". Los obispos de los Estados Unidos también nos han proporcionado "Ciudadanía fiel: una guía para la participación política" (<https://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/faithful-citizenship/upload/spanish-faithful-citizenship.pdf>) y el documento de 1998 "Vivir el Evangelio de la Vida".

Hay una serie de excelentes guías de votantes católicos disponibles que se basan en los documentos antes mencionados. Una de las guías que he encontrado útil es la titulada "2020 Cuestiones para Votantes Católicos" en el sitio web "Mujeres de Gracia". Esta guía se puede encontrar aquí (en inglés): https://www.womenofgrace.com/App_Uploads_Docs/Document/VotersGuide2020-Update2.pdf Como los "Temas del 2020" señala hay algunos principios básicos de los cuales todos debemos estar conscientes. Estos son de los principios a los que me refería en el primer párrafo. Cuando se trata de navegar entre candidatos y cuestiones políticas, encuentro muy útil la distinción que la guía hace entre cuestiones "resueltas" y "prudenciales". Como señala la guía, un problema es "resuelto" cuando implica rechazar un mal intrínseco. Una cuestión se considera "prudencial" porque "al aplicar principios generales a situaciones específicas se puede extraer una variedad de conclusiones válidas". Además, y esto es de suma importancia: "las cuestiones resueltas tienen más peso para el votante católico que las cuestiones prudenciales". Lo siguiente se considerarían cuestiones resueltas: aborto, eutanasia y suicidio asistido, células madre fetales y clonación, matrimonio, libertad religiosa y racismo. Las siguientes son cuestiones prudenciales: atención de la salud, pena de muerte, guerra y paz, pobreza, inmigración, educación, población, poder judicial, economía, fiscalidad y medio ambiente. Dado que las cuestiones resueltas tienen más peso que las cuestiones prudenciales, es im-

portante considerar cuidadosamente la postura de un candidato sobre las cuestiones resueltas a la hora de discernir cómo votar. Además, es importante tener en cuenta las cuestiones resueltas a la hora de discernir cómo votar sobre cuestiones particulares.

Si bien esta columna no me permite el espacio para entrar en más detalles para cada una de estas cuestiones resueltas y prudenciales, le recomiendo encarecidamente que busquen la guía ustedes mismos, la lean y la estudien. Es claro, preciso y relativamente fácil de entender, incluso para alguien como yo que preferiría hablar de deportes en lugar de política. Que Dios nos guíe en noviembre para que escojamos líderes civiles y votemos sobre temas de acuerdo con Su voluntad y por Su mayor honor y gloria.

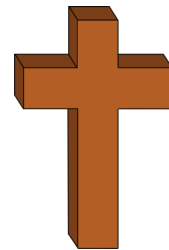

SANTA TERESITA DEL NIÑO JESÚS (1873-1897) 1º de octubre

Teresita es la más joven de las doctoras de la Iglesia, pues murió a los 24 años, víctima de la tuberculosis. Jamás salió del convento carmelita en que vivía, pero siempre oró intensamente por los sacerdotes y los misioneros, llegando a ser la patrona de las misiones. Su vida no fue fácil, pues quedó huérfana de madre a los 4 años y se vio forzada a emigrar a otra ciudad con su padre y tres hermanas María, Paulina y Celinia. Desde los 9 años se dio cuenta de que quería ser carmelita, pero su edad se lo impedía, hasta que a los 15 años le pide personalmente al Papa León XIII que le otorgue el permiso para ser admitida como religiosa carmelita. Así fue. Como religiosa destacó por la profundidad de su relación con Dios y la austeridad con que vivía, practicando la oración y la mortificación cristiana, pese a una salud muy delicada. Respecto a sus sufrimientos escribió: "He llegado a un punto en el que me es imposible sufrir, porque todo sufrimiento es dulce". Fue canonizada en 1925.

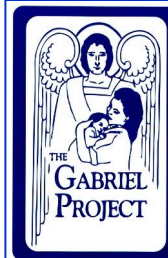
